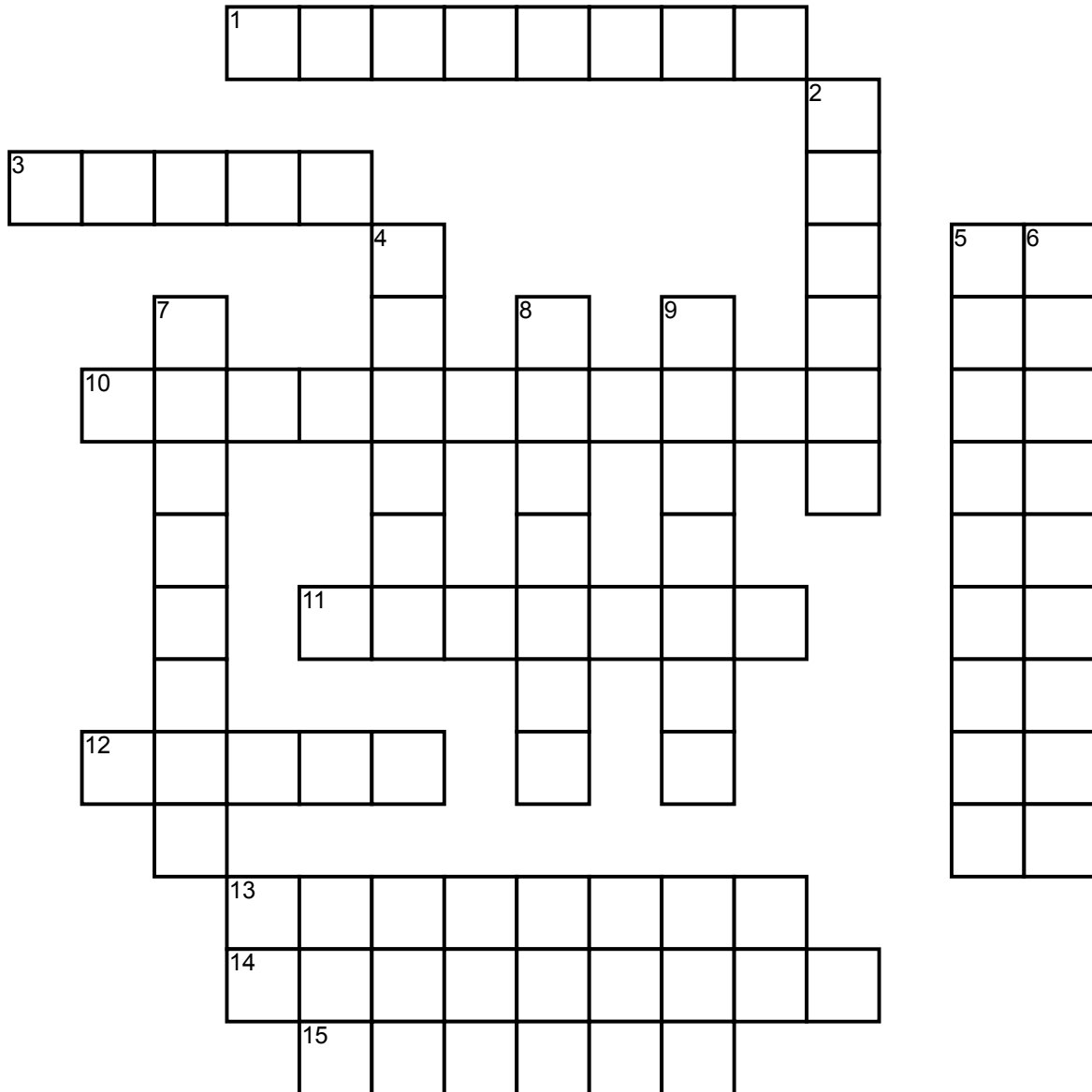


Johnny Tremain
