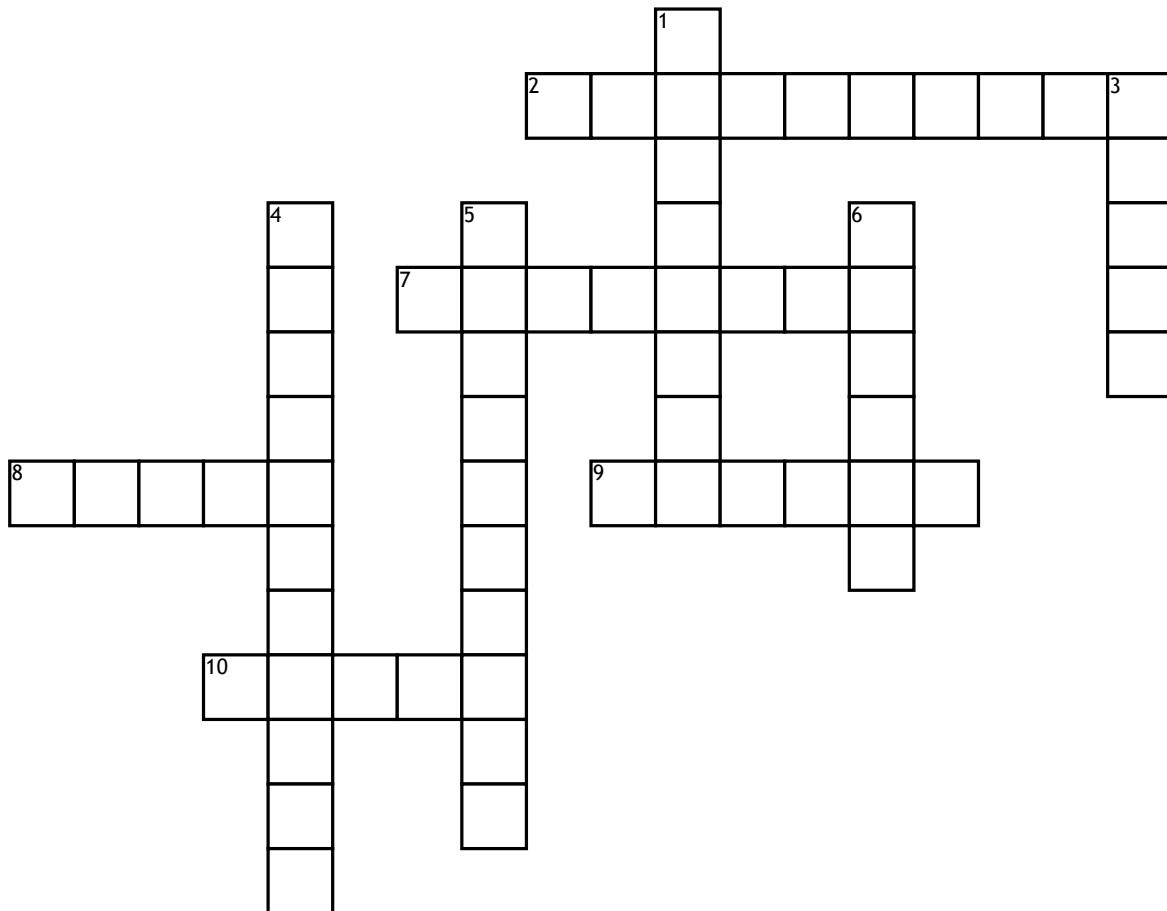


Julius Ceasar: Rhetorical Devices
