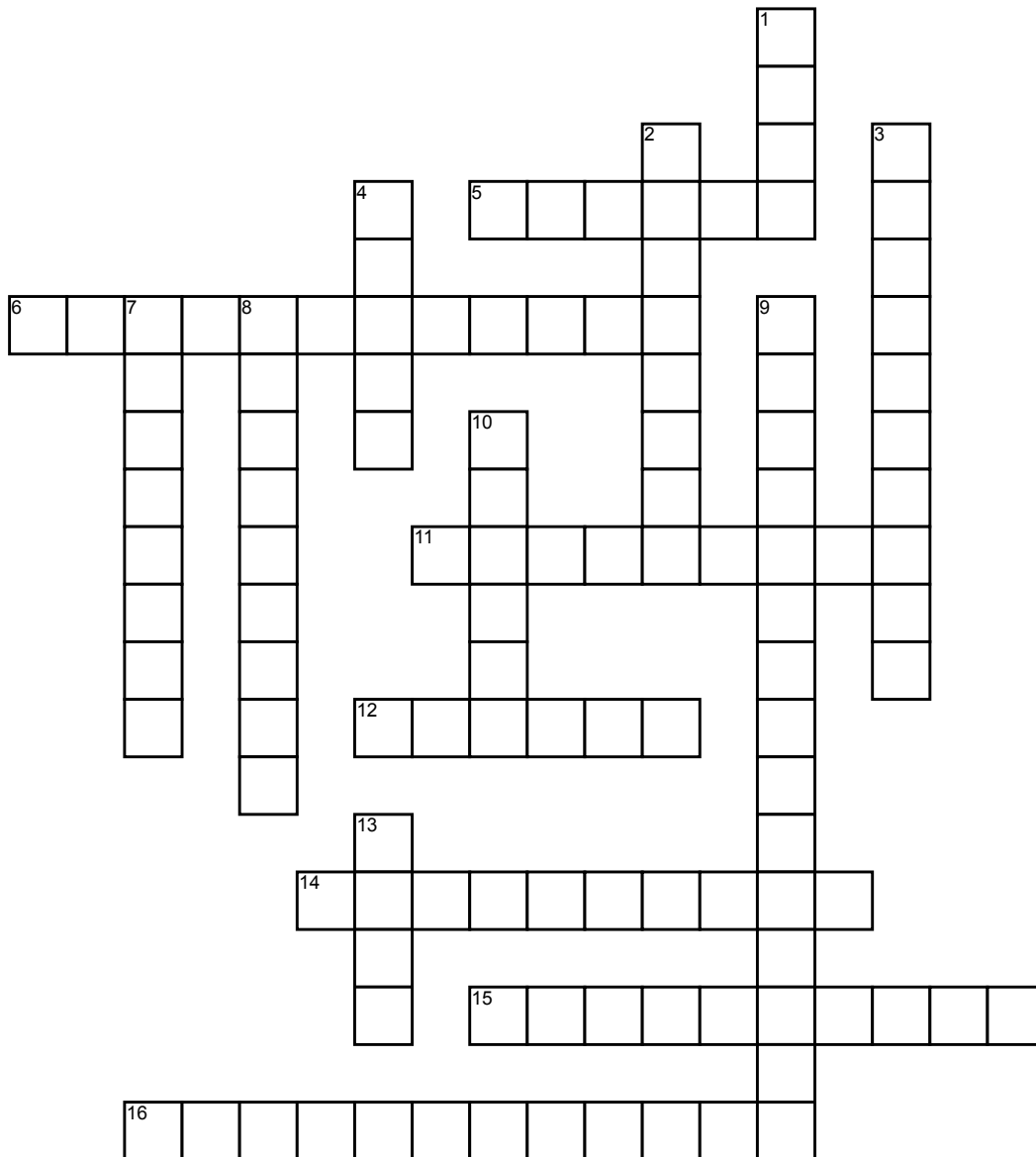


# Language devices

- 5.** A word that describes a verb  
**6.** A word that sounds like the noise it is describing: 'splash', 'bang'  
**11.** Extreme exaggeration that is not meant to be taken literally  
**12.** A phrase which establishes similarity between two things to emphasise the point being made

**14.** Informal language in a text

**15.** The repetition of a word or phrase to achieve a particular effect

**16.** 3 or more words that begin with the same letter

- 1.** A doing word  
**2.** A word or phrase used to imply figurative, not literal or 'actual', resemblance  
**3.** A device in poetry where a sentence runs onto the next line or verse

**4.** Humorous or sarcastic use of words implying the opposite of what they mean

**7.** Where two words normally not associated are brought together: 'cold heat'
