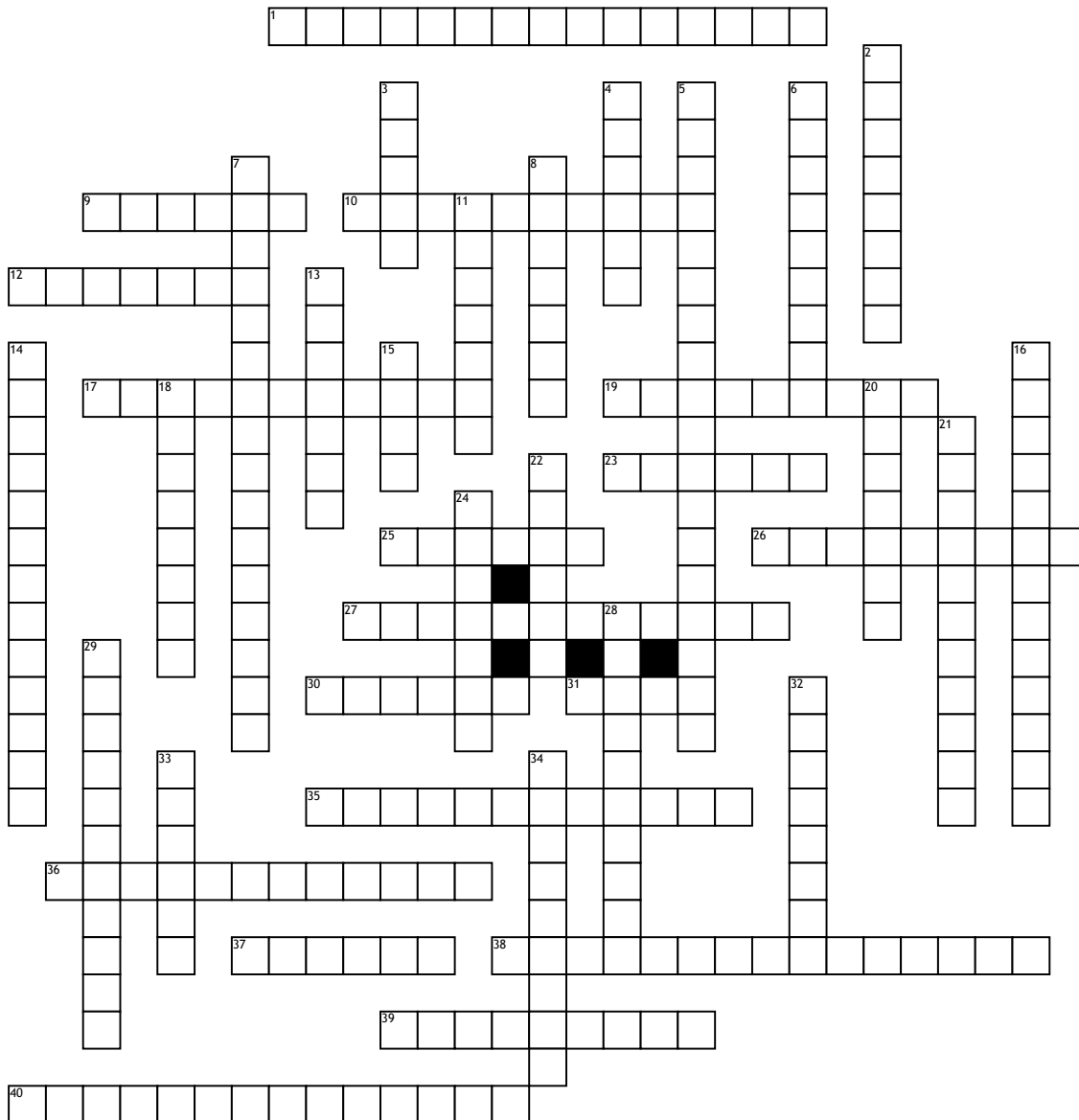

- 1. a non-criminal order obtained by abused spouse against abusive spouse
- 9. the calendar or schedule of cases before a judge. Each has a number assigned to it
- 10. the living apart of a married couple
- 12. the plaintiff and the defendant
- 17. a written statement made to the court under oath
- 19. a court order to the sheriff to seize goods the defendant owns
- 23. a request to the court
- 25. husband or wife
- 26. the person who started the case.
- 27. the defendant's claim against the plaintiff
- 30. the written response to a complaint, petition, or motion
- 31. a dispute which has been taken to court; a lawsuit
- 35. land or buildings

- 2. a legal paper that starts a case. Also called a complaint
- 3. a judge or chancellor enters an order when he or she signs the order and the order is filed with the Court Clerk
- 4. giving the clerk of court your legal papers
- 5. a procedure whereby a portion of the defendant's wages are deducted regularly and paid to the plaintiff to satisfy a judgement
- 6. a court's decision
- 7. movable property or possessions, as distinguished from real property
- 8. a member of the judge staff who is in charge of courtroom procedure and security.
- 11. a payment of support provided by one spouse to the other
- 13. a party's failure to answer a complaint, motion, or petition
- 14. a person who is qualified by special knowledge or experience to give an opinion on the matter in dispute
- 15. a charge or claim on property belonging to another, for the satisfaction of a debt or duty

- 16. a copy of a paper from a court file made by the court clerk, which has an official stamp on it. Usually, you must pay a fee for a certified copy
- 18. failure to follow a court order. One side can request that the court determine that the other side is in contempt and punish him or her
- 20. the official written statement of a case, the court's decision and its reasons for reaching the decision it did
- 21. delaying your court hearing to a later date
- 22. hears cases like a judge. A master's decision is reviewed by a judge before becoming final
- 24. attorney; lawyer
- 28. a trial judge who now has essentially the same responsibilities as a Circuit Judge but who, in English history, had somewhat different ones
- 29. the legal end of a marriage. Another word for divorce
- 32. a testimony of witnesses and documents which are presented to the court and considered by the court in making decision
- 33. a lawsuit or proceeding in a court of law
