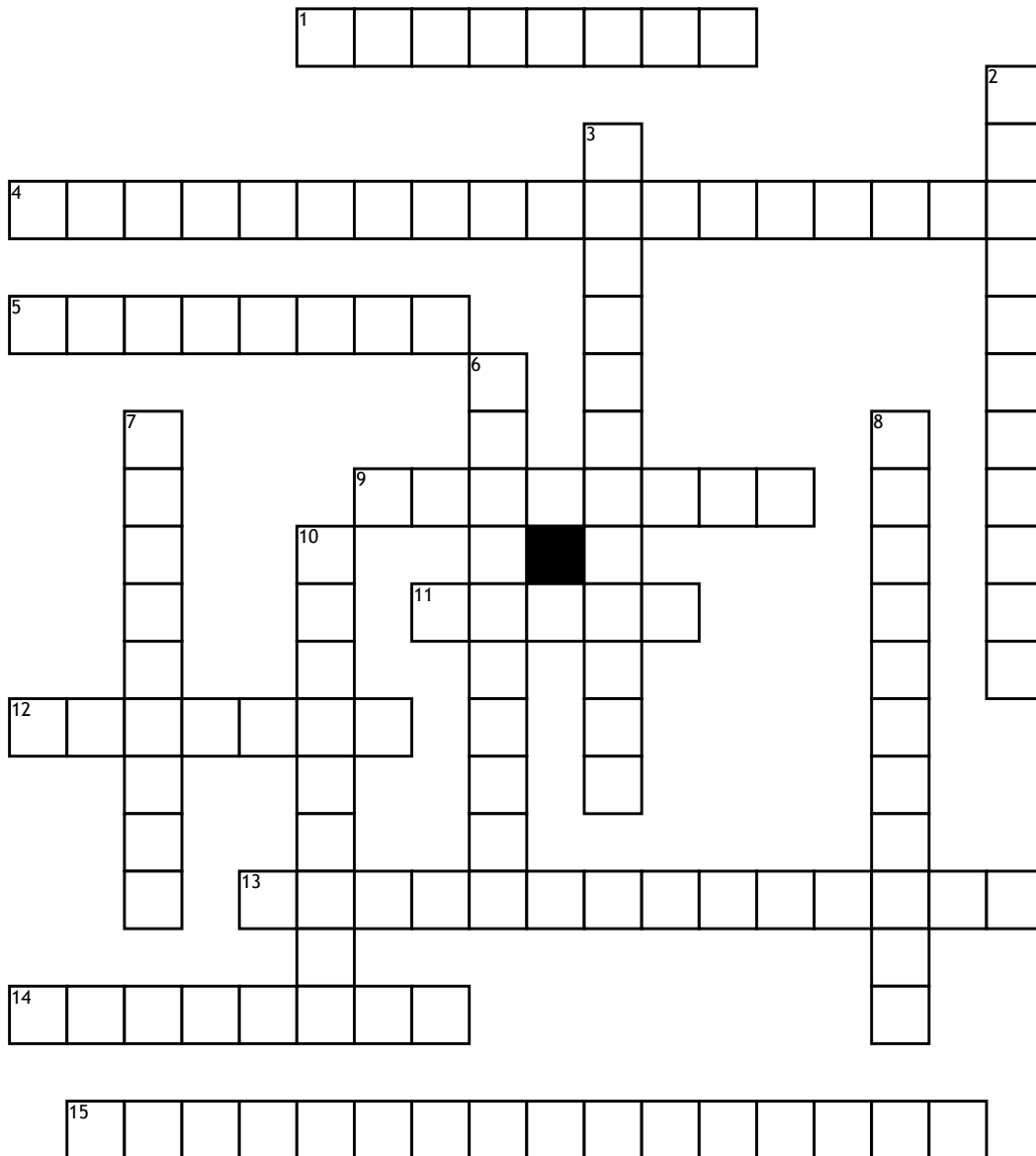

## **Across**
