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| 1. Bad practice - harmful, incorrect, or negligent practice or treatment of a patient by a health care provider. (Professional Negligence) | A. Assault |
| 2. Failure to give care that is normally expected in a particular position and results in injury to a patient. | B. False Imprisonment |
| 3. a wrongful act or an infringement of a right (other than under contract) leading to civil legal liability. | C. Malpractice |
| 4. Holding a person against his/her will by using a restrictive device or other means. | D. Tort |
| 5. The giving out of information about an individual or patient without his/her consent. | E. Invasion of privacy |
| 6. To be legally responsible for failing to perform professional duties to meet the standards of care and/or causing harm or injury. | F. Expressed Contract |
| 7. May include a threat or attempt to injure a patient. | G. Negligence |
| 8. Unlawful touching of another person without consent. | H. Implied Contract |
| 9. Gives rise to contractual obligations by some action or inaction without verbally expressed terms. | I. Battery |
| 10. Agreement between the parties, the terms are stated indistinct and explicit language, either orally or in writing. | J. Liable |
