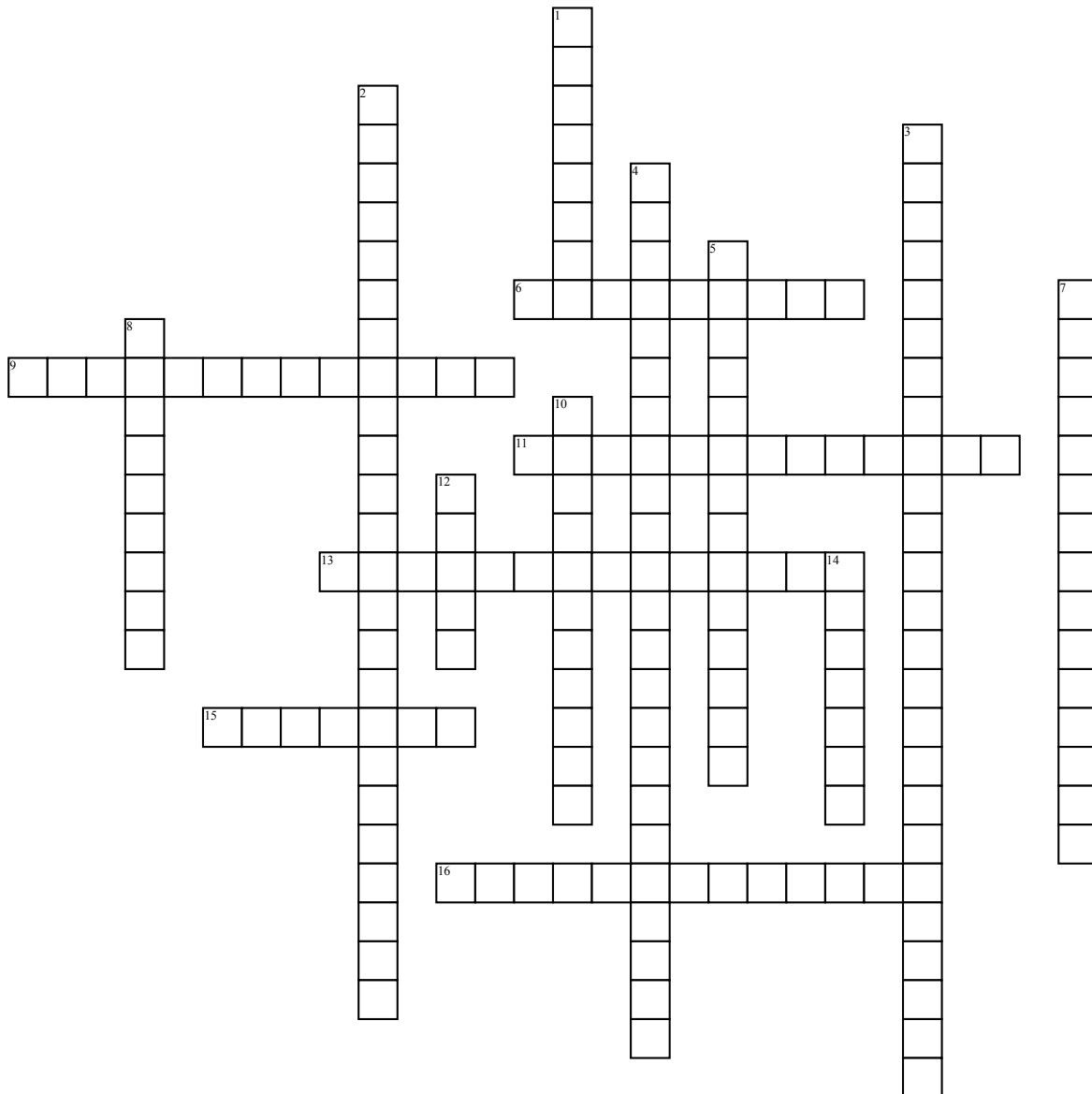


Literacy Vocabulary Crossword Puzzle (page 1)

6. To say, state, or render again, after an initial preview.

9. A type of text often used in beginning reading instruction. With this type of text, new readers can decipher words using the phonics skills they have been taught.

11. Small-group reading instruction designed to help with developing reading proficiency.

13. Clusters of 2 to 3 consonants in a word that build a distinct sound, such as “bl,” or “spl.”

15. Distinct units of sound.

16. Where everyone in the class (including the teacher) reads aloud.

Down

1. Individual letters and groups of letters that represent single phonemes.

2. The ability to process information we have read, and understanding its meaning.

3. When less than 85% of the words are recognized.

4. Highest level you would ask a child to read with only a small amount of assistance.

5. Examples are “fan,” “an,” and “left.” A syllable that ends with a consonant.

7. Builds from part to whole, starting with single letters, then graduating to sounds.

8. To examine and note similarities or differences.

10. The act of finding the most important ideas in a text.

12. The acquisition of a skill.

14. A combination of two letters, representing one sound.
