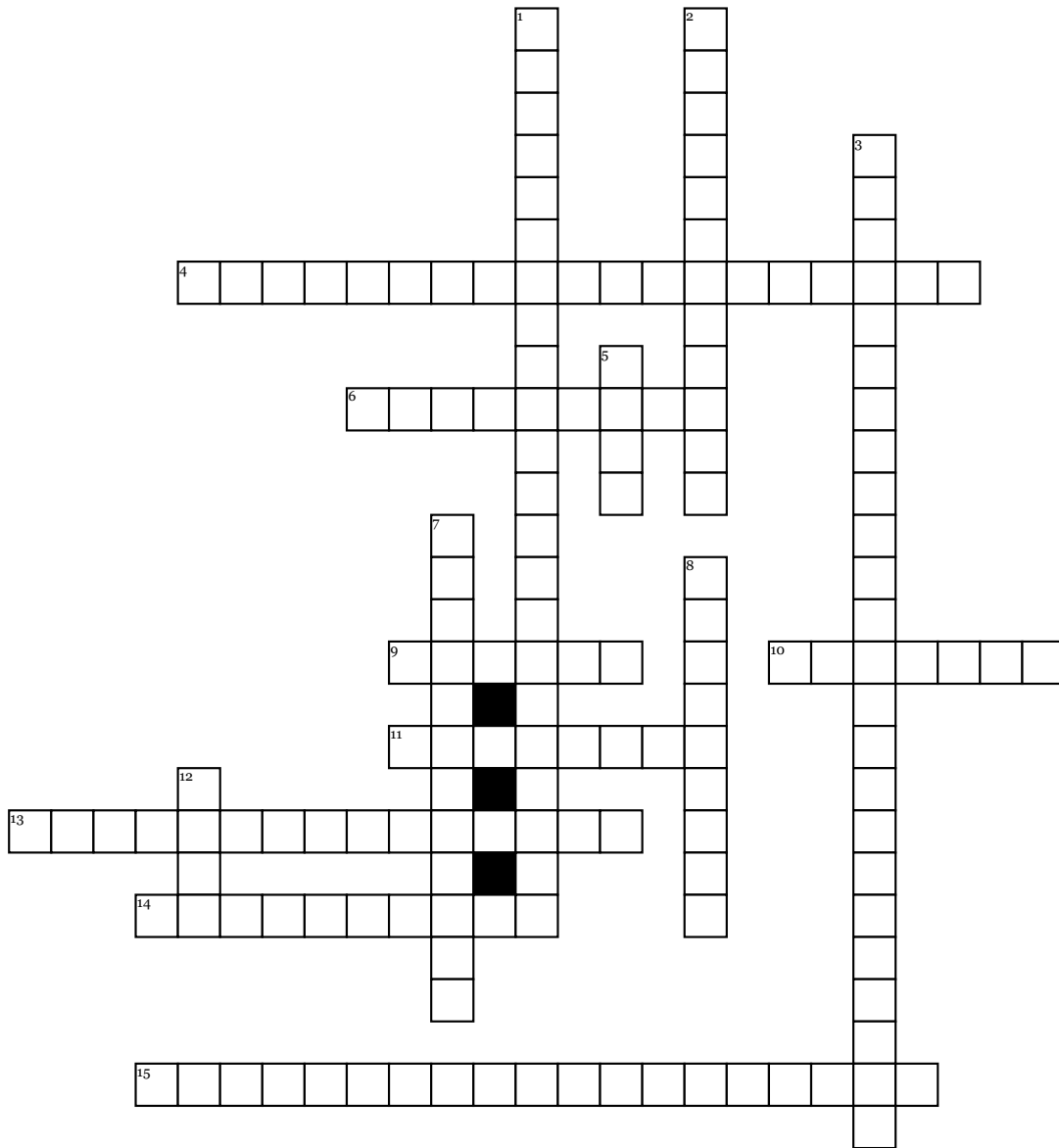


Literary Term Crossword Puzzle
