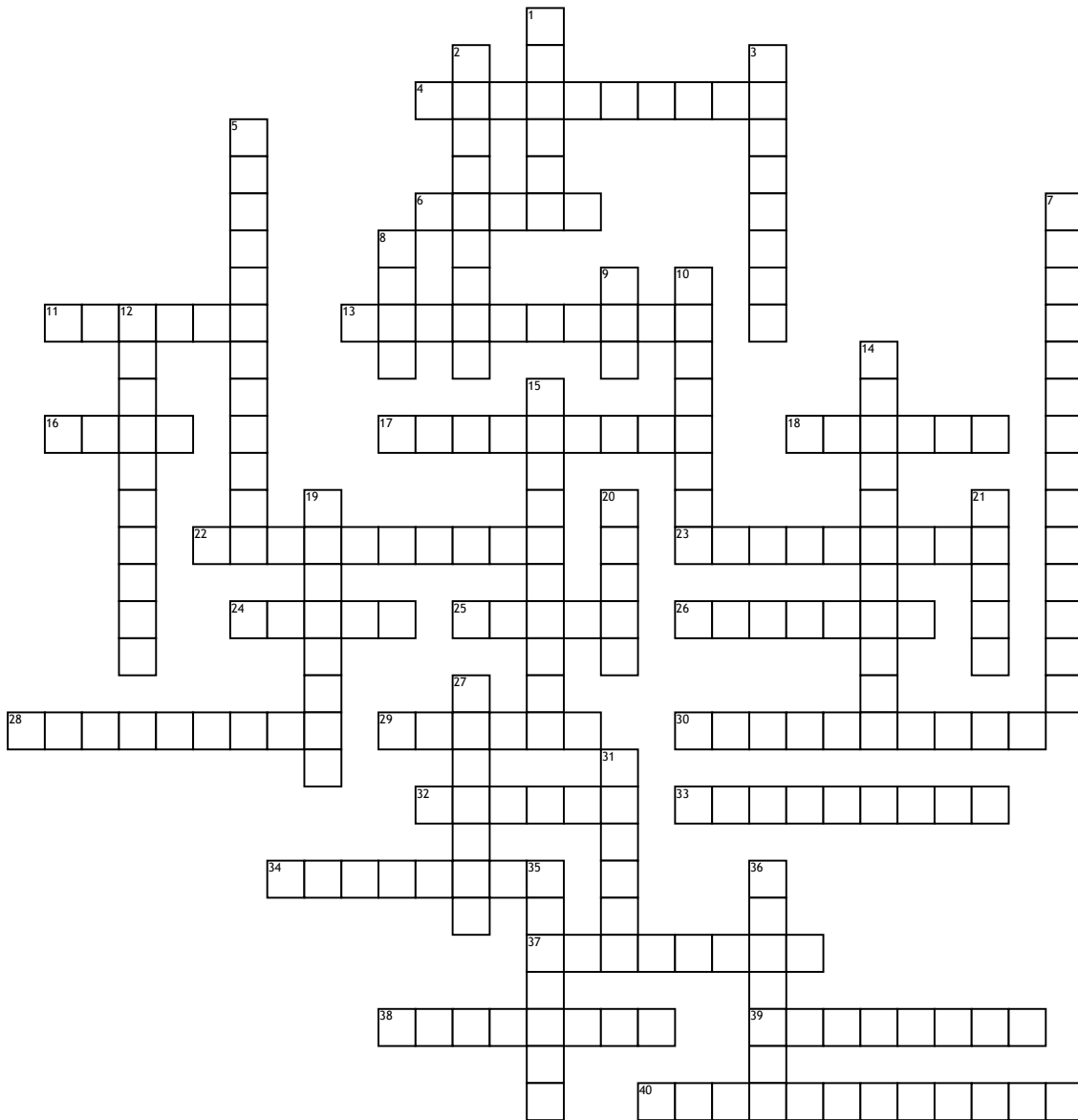


Literary Terms Crossword Puzzle
