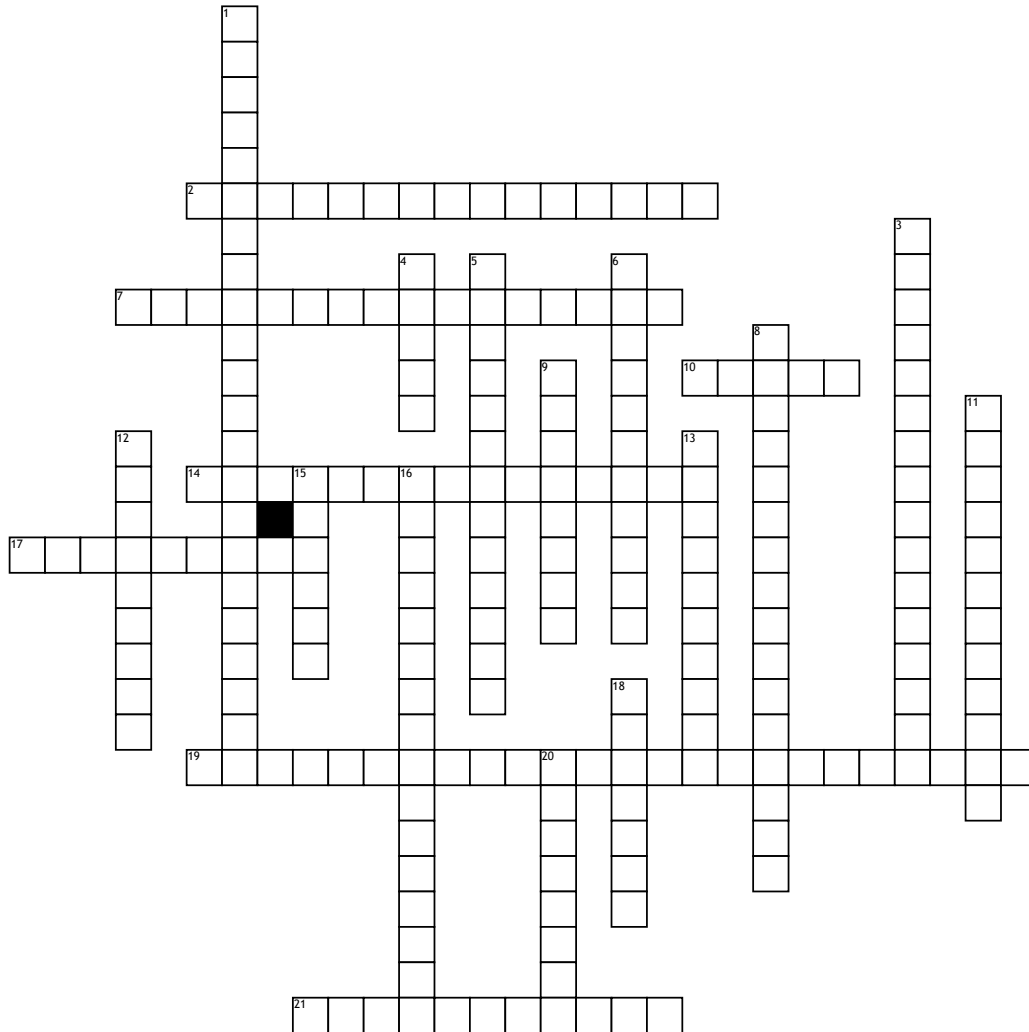


Literary elements
