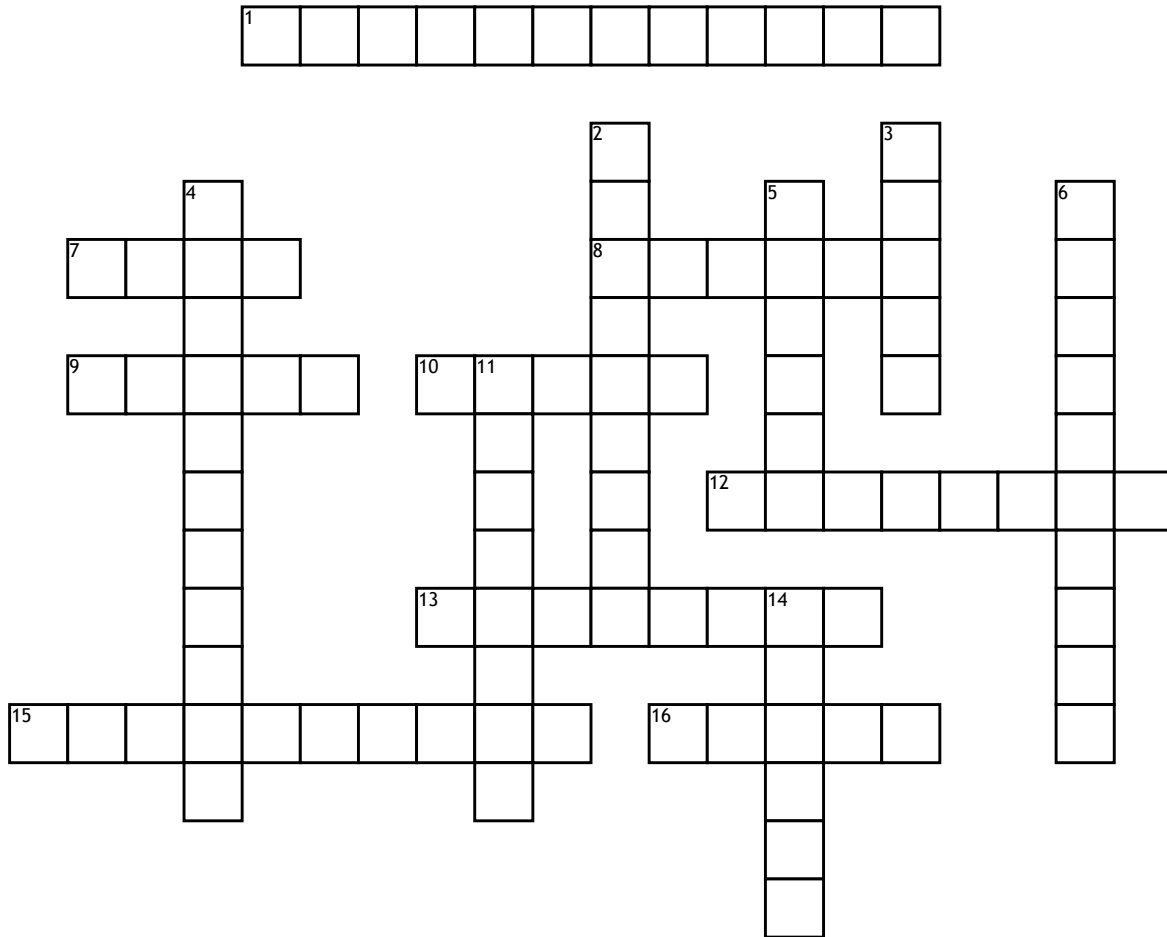

# Literary terms



## Across

1. Literary device where two or more words in close proximity share the same initial consonant sound.

7. This term refers to the overall structure of a poem - the number of lines, the rhyme scheme and its meter.

8. A work that uses ridicule, humour, and wit to criticize and provoke change in human nature and institutions.

9. This term refers to the repetition of sound patterns that creates a rhythm in poetry.

10. A part of a story or drama that takes place at a single time and in a single location, consisting of a want, obstacle and outcome.

12. This term indicates the comparison of one thing to another without the use of "like" or "as."

13. This term refers to a story with two levels of meaning: the "surface" of the story, and the symbolic, or deeper, meaning.

15. In literature, this term refers to repetitive sounds produced by consonants within a sentence or phrase.

16. In poetry, this term describes the repetition of the same or similar sound at the end of two or more lines.

## Down

2. This term refers to the repetition of a vowel sound in a line of text or poetry.

3. This word identifies the big idea in a work of literature.

4. The character who serves as the focus for a story's themes and incidents.

5. This word indicates a comparison between two different things using "as" or "like."

6. The major character in a narrative or drama who works against the hero.

11. This term refers to the struggle between two opposing forces in a story.

14. This term refers to the overall "beat" of a poem.
