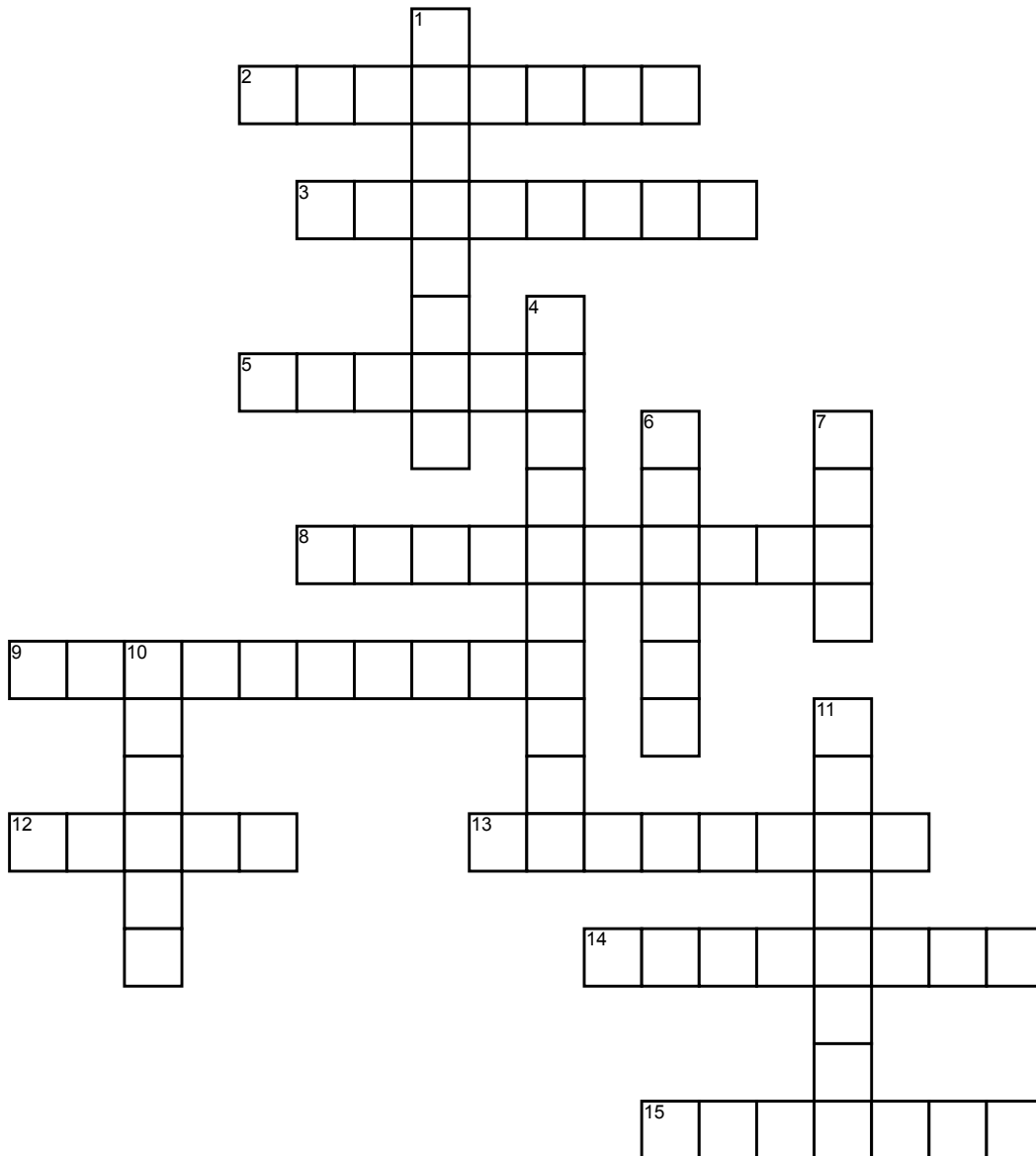

- 2. Bacterial skin infection marked with red/yellow weeping lesions
- 3. Pain/tingling felt from lower back along pathway of sciatic nerve
- 5. flat spots on the skin; freckles
- 8. Chronic, progressive dementia caused by atrophy of brain tissue
- 9. Discoloration of the skin, bruise

- 12. Large blister or skin vesicle filled with fluid
- 13. Surgical cut in the flesh
- 14. Chronic disorder of the brain marked by recurrent seizures
- 15. Noncontagious illness marked by skeletal muscle spasms; know as lockjaw

Down

- 1. Acute, reversible state of agitated confusion

- 4. Mood disorder causing loss of interest or pleasure in living
- 6. Blackhead
- 7. Fluid pouch in or under the skin
- 10. Thickened, toughened area of skin caused by chronic pressure/friction
- 11. Autoimmune Dz that results in hair loss
