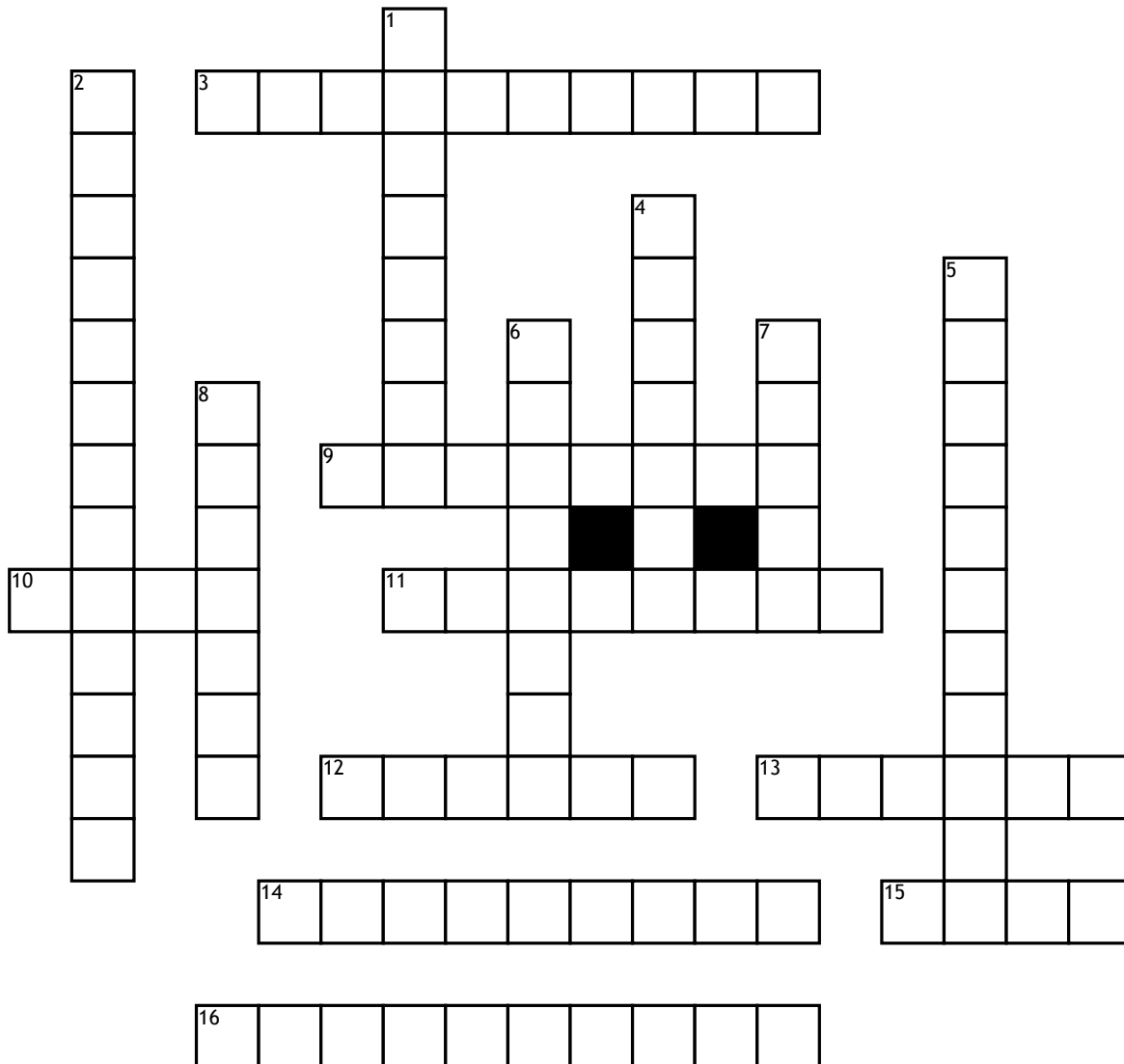


# MUSICALS
