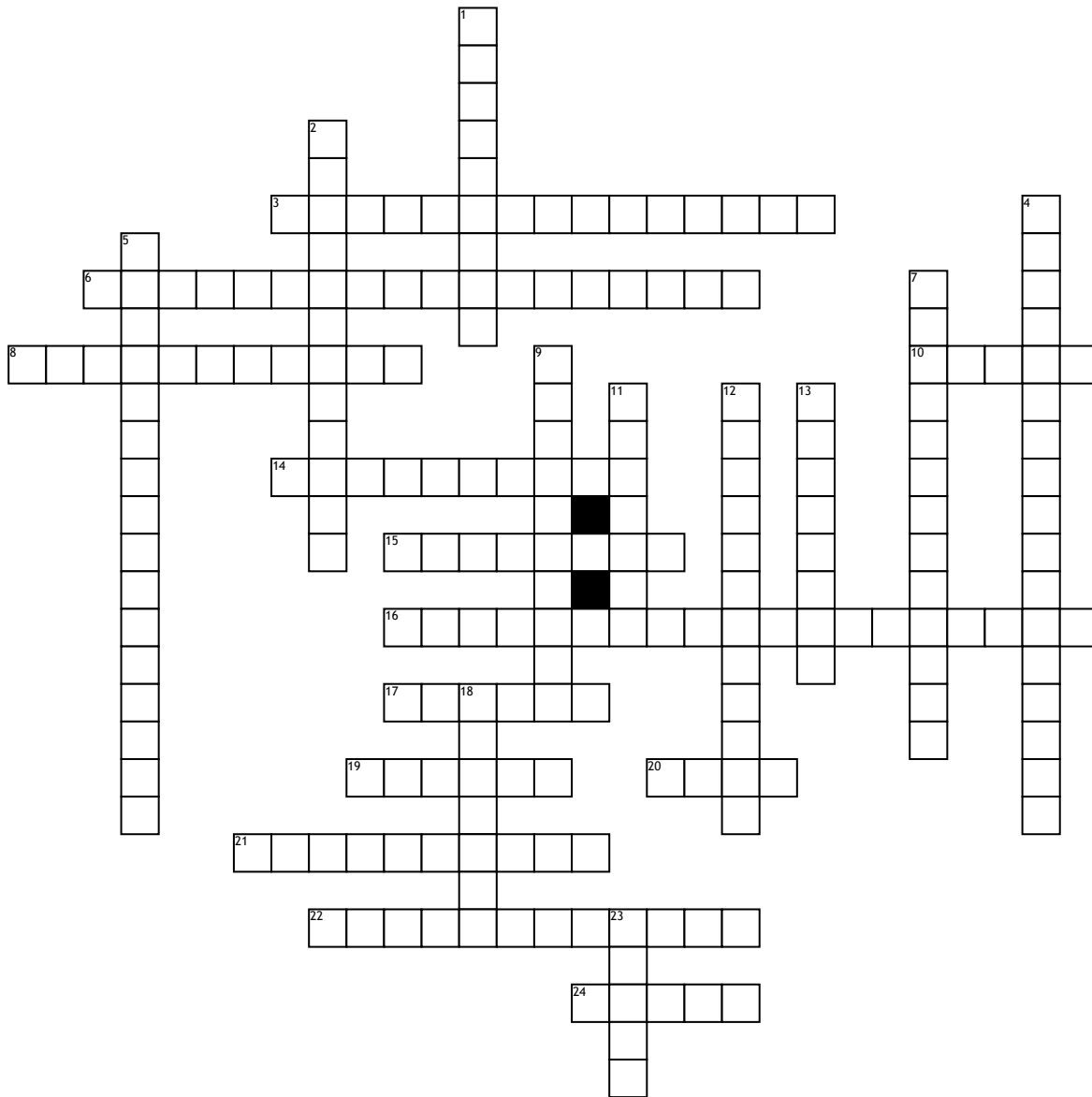


March Crossword
