1. Drugs used to treat or prevent diseases or other conditions
 2. Substances other than food that change the structure or function of body or mind
 3. Most commonly used medicines, also known as pain relievers
 4. Reactions to medicine other than the one intended
 5. Body becomes used to the effect of the medicine, and the body requires an increased dosage to produce the same effect.
 6. Medicines that are dispensed only with written approval of a licensed physician
 7. Medicines you can buy without a doctor's prescription
 8. Intentionally taking medicines for nonmedical purposes
 9. A strong, sometimes fatal reaction to taking a large amount of a drug
 10. Using a medicine in ways other than the intended use
 11. Any unnecessary or improper use of chemical substances for nonmedical purposes
 12. Chemical substances that people of any age may not lawfully manufacture, possess, buy, or sell.
 13. The use or sale of any substance that is illegal or otherwise not permitted
 14. A psysiological or psychological dependence on a drug
 15. Person believes that a drug is necessary for them to feel good or to function normally
