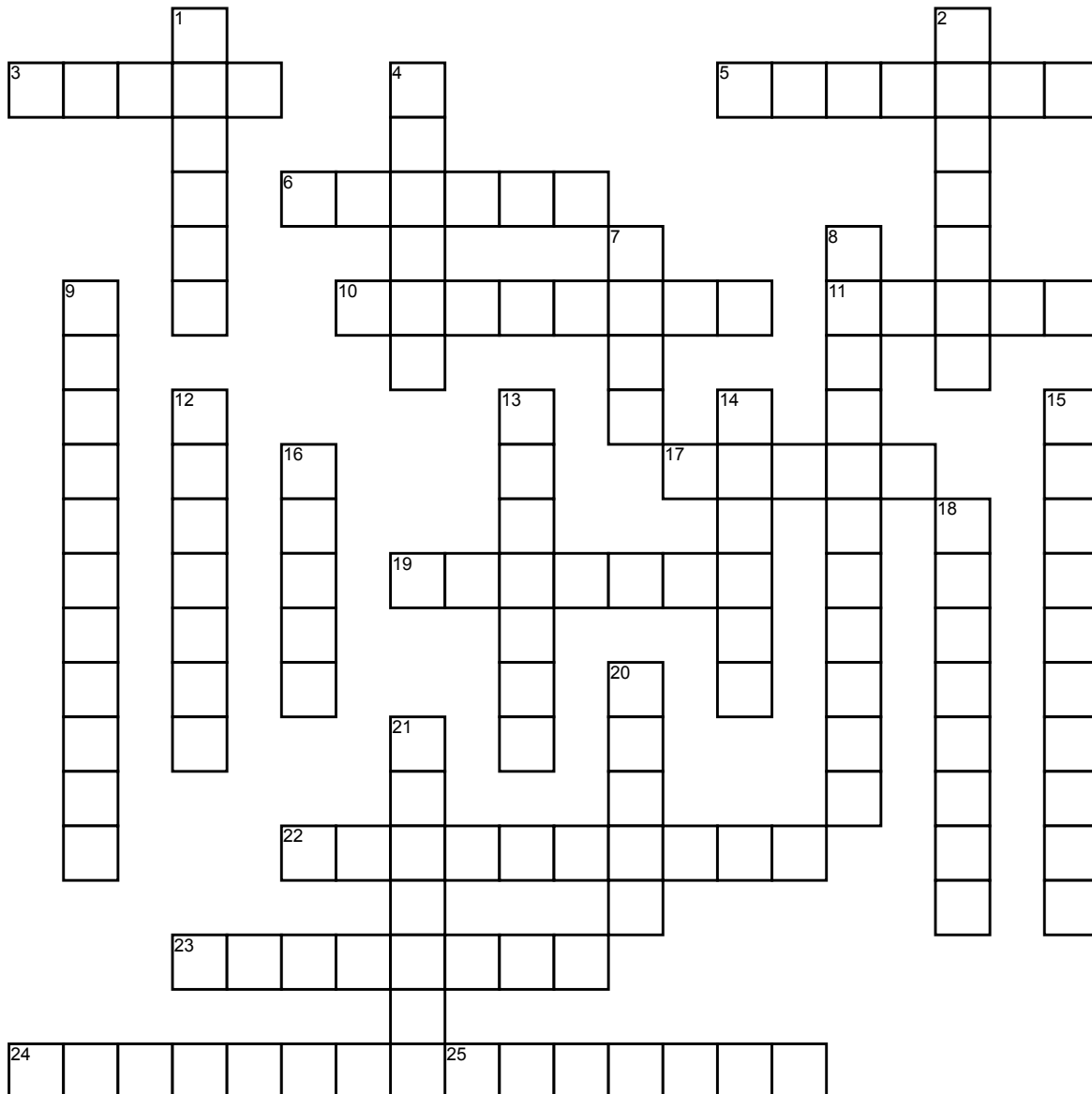


Merchant of Venice Vocabulary Crossword
