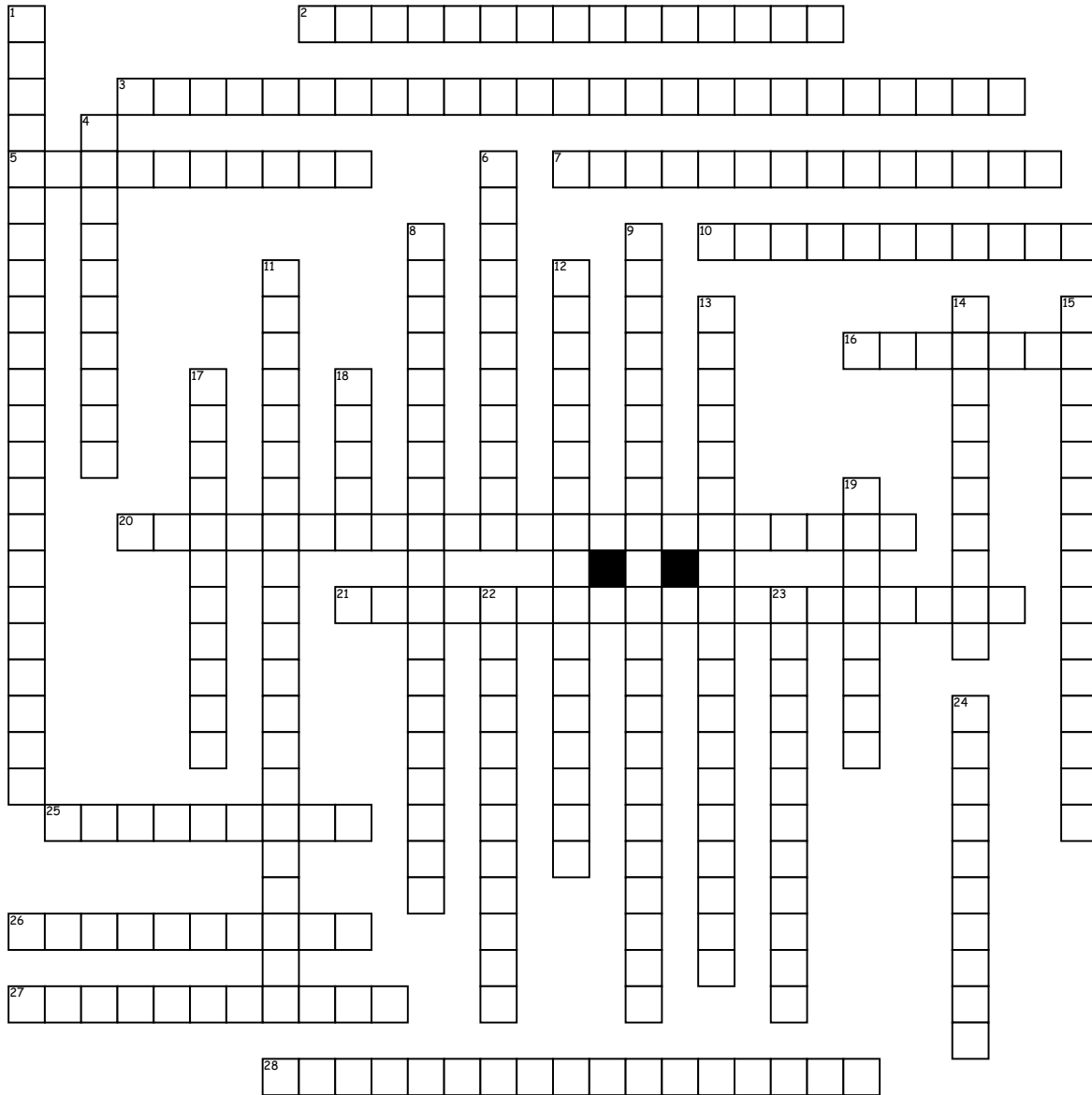

- 2. Permanent movement, compelled by cultural or environmental factors
- 3. Someone who has been forced to migrate for similar political reasons as refugee but has not migrated across an international border
- 5. Transfer of money by workers to people in country from which they emigrated
- 7. Migration of people to a specific location because relatives or members of the same nationality previously migrated here
- 10. Short term, repetitive, or cyclical movements that recurs on a regular basis
- 16. Someone who is forced to migrate from their country and cannot return for fear of persecution because of their race, religion, nationality, membership in social group, or political opinion
- 20. Permanent movement from one country to another
- 21. Change in the migration pattern in society that results from industrialization, population growth, and other social and economic changes that also produces demographic transition

- 25. Form of relocation diffusion that involves a permanent move to new location
 - 26. large-scale emigration by talented people
 - 27. Factor that induces people to move to a new location
 - 28. Temporary movement of a migrant worker between home and host countries to seek employment

- 13. Net migration from urban to rural areas in more develop countries
- 14. Factor that induces people to move out of their present location
- 15. Degradation of land, especially in semiarid areas, primarily because of human actions such as excessive crop planting, animal grazing, and tree cutting. Also known as semiarid land degradation
- 17. Term used once for a worker who migrated to develop countries of Northern/Western Europe, usually from Southern/Eastern Europe or North Africa, in search of higher paying jobs
- 18. Reference to migration, law that places a maximum limit on the # of people who can immigrate to a country each year
- 19. All types of movement between locations
- 22. Someone who has migrated to another country in the hope of being recognized as a refugee
- 23. Difference between the level of immigration and the level of emigration
- 24. Area subject to flooding during a given number of years, according to historical trends
