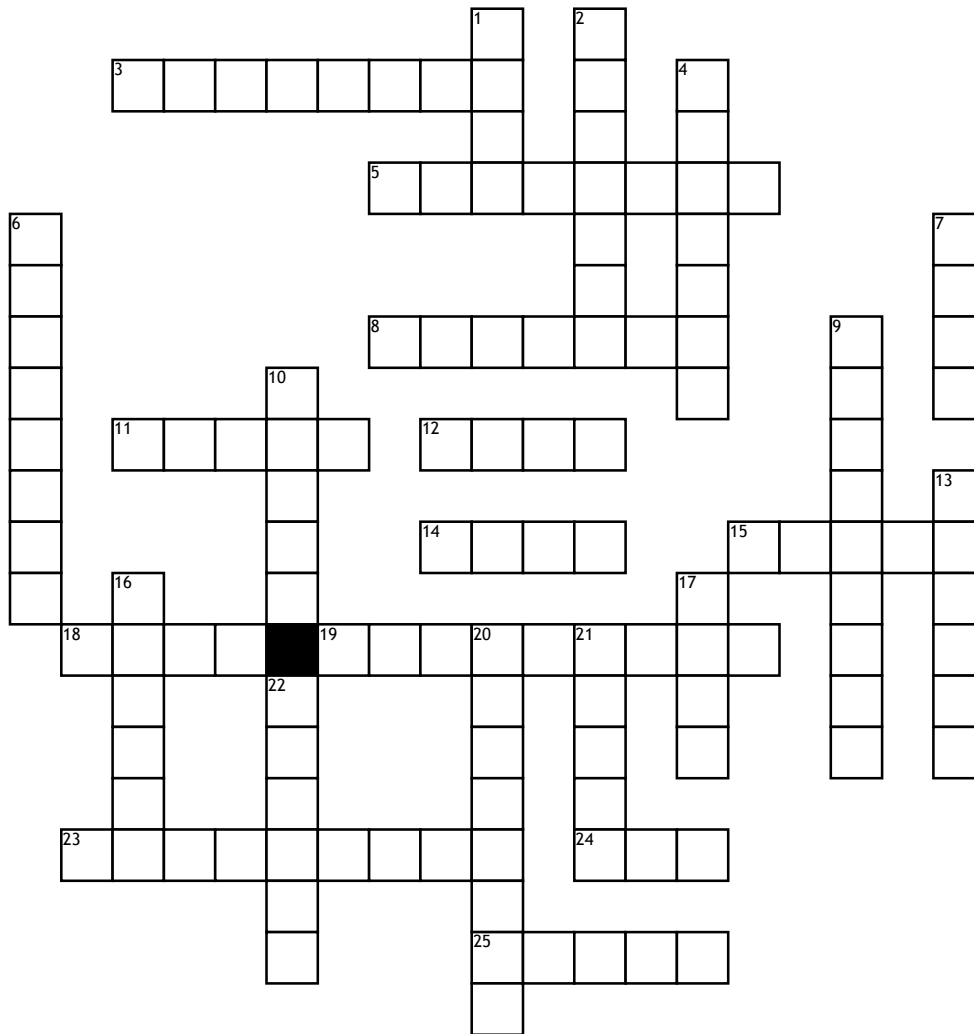


Mock Trial Crossword
