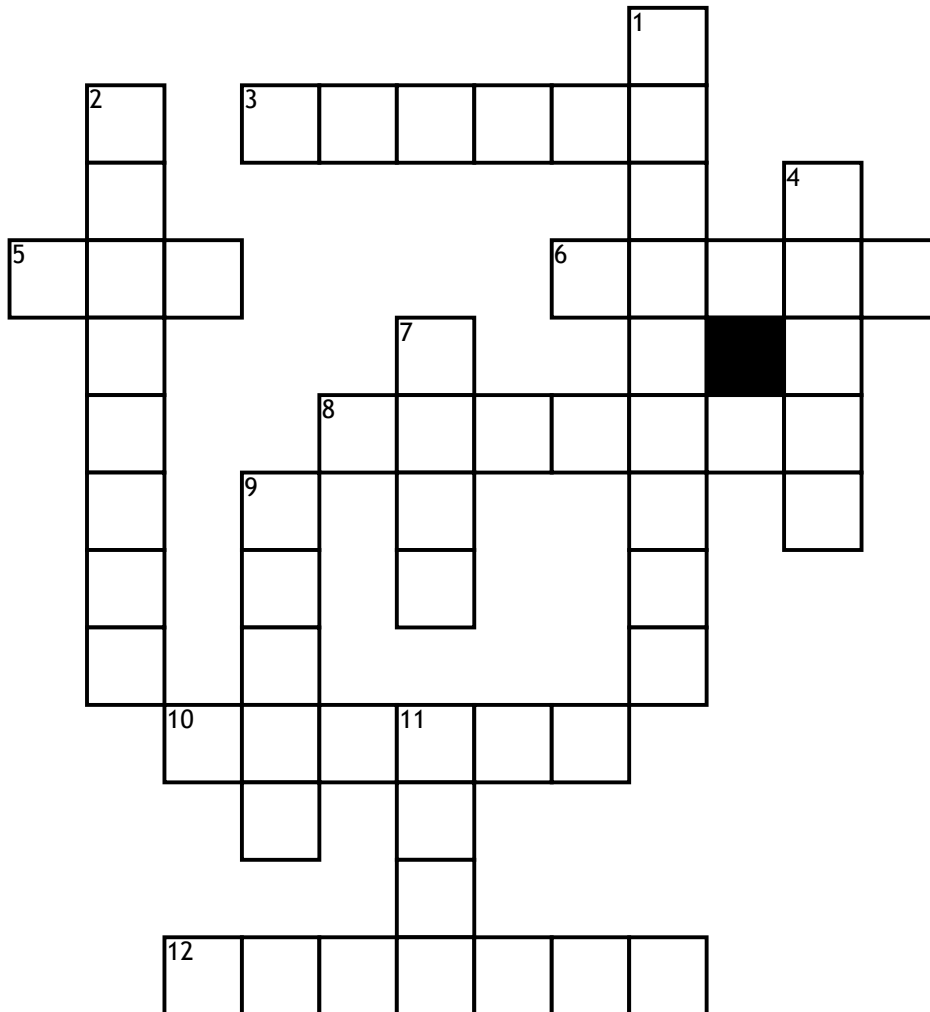


Musical Genres

3. Religious music that first came out of African-American churches in the 1930's

5. Any genre of music having wide appeal (but usually only for a short time)

6. a sacred song or hymn, in particular any of those contained in the biblical Book of Psalms and used in Christian and Jewish worship.

8. An American musical genre, enjoying its peak popularity around the years 1900-1918. This genre identifies as a dance form written in 2/4 or 4/4 time, and utilizing a walking bass,
