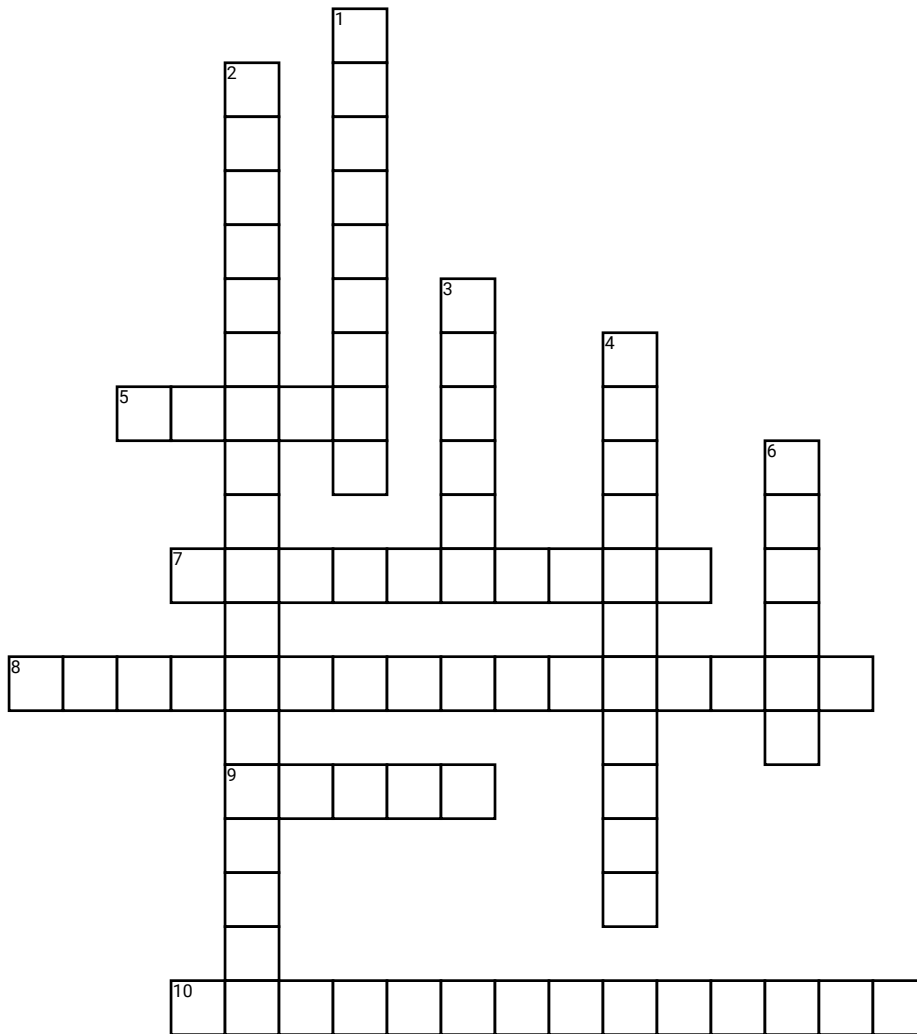


# Mythology
