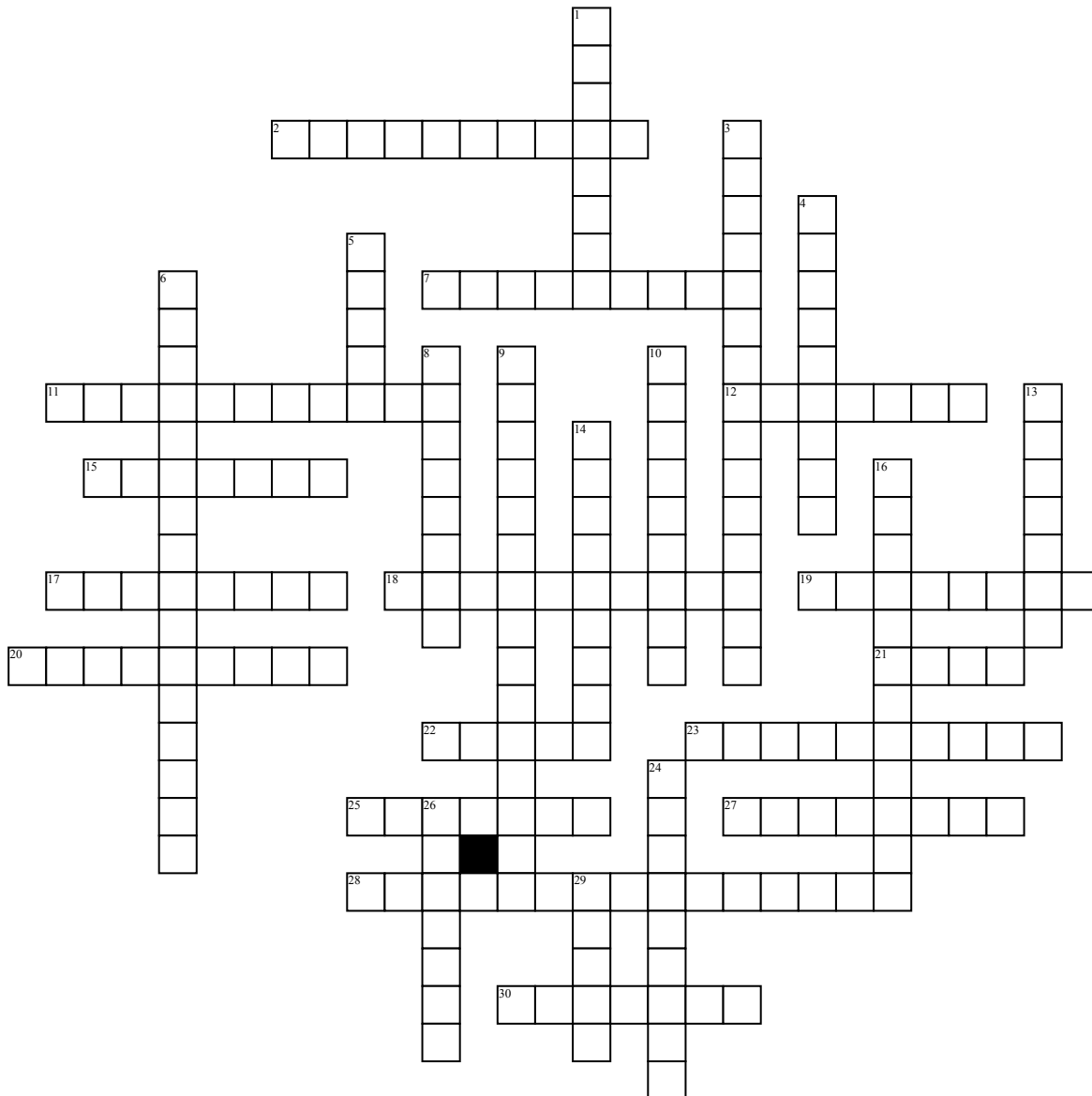

20. Nero's "Judge of Elegant Things", supposed author of the *Satyricon*.

21. Name of the brother of the Roman Emperor that passed the Antonine Constitution.
