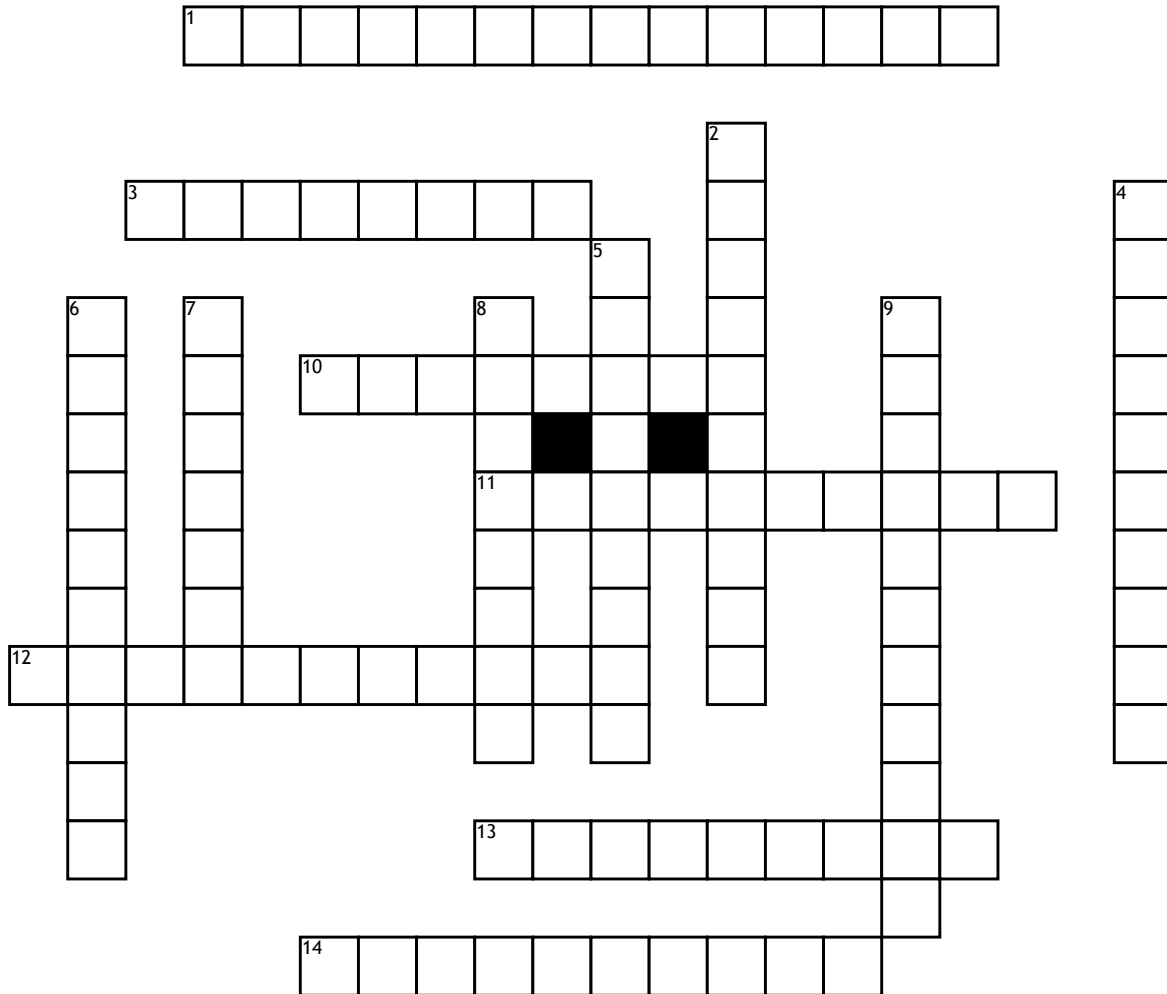

## Across

- 1. Potassium sparing diuretic
- 3. Antihistamine given to relieve symptoms of sneezing and itching
- 10. Antibiotic often first choice for pneumonia patients, especially if patient allergic to PCN
- 11. Common loop diuretic
- 12. First drug given when patient begins to have an anaphalactic reaction

- 13. calcium channel blocker that cannot be mixed with grapefruit and grapefruit juice
- 14. antibiotic that can cause "red-man syndrome" when infused too quickly

## Down

- 2. Glucocorticoid used to suppress the inflammatory response
- 4. Beta blocker that when taken patient needs to be monitored for orthostatic hypotension

- 5. NSAID used to manage pain, fever, and inflammation
- 6. ACE inhibitor that can cause a nagging cough as a side effect
- 7. Anticoagulant medication given with initial bolus to break up clots
- 8. Anticoagulant not compatible with St. John's Wort
- 9. expectorant used with pneumonia patients
