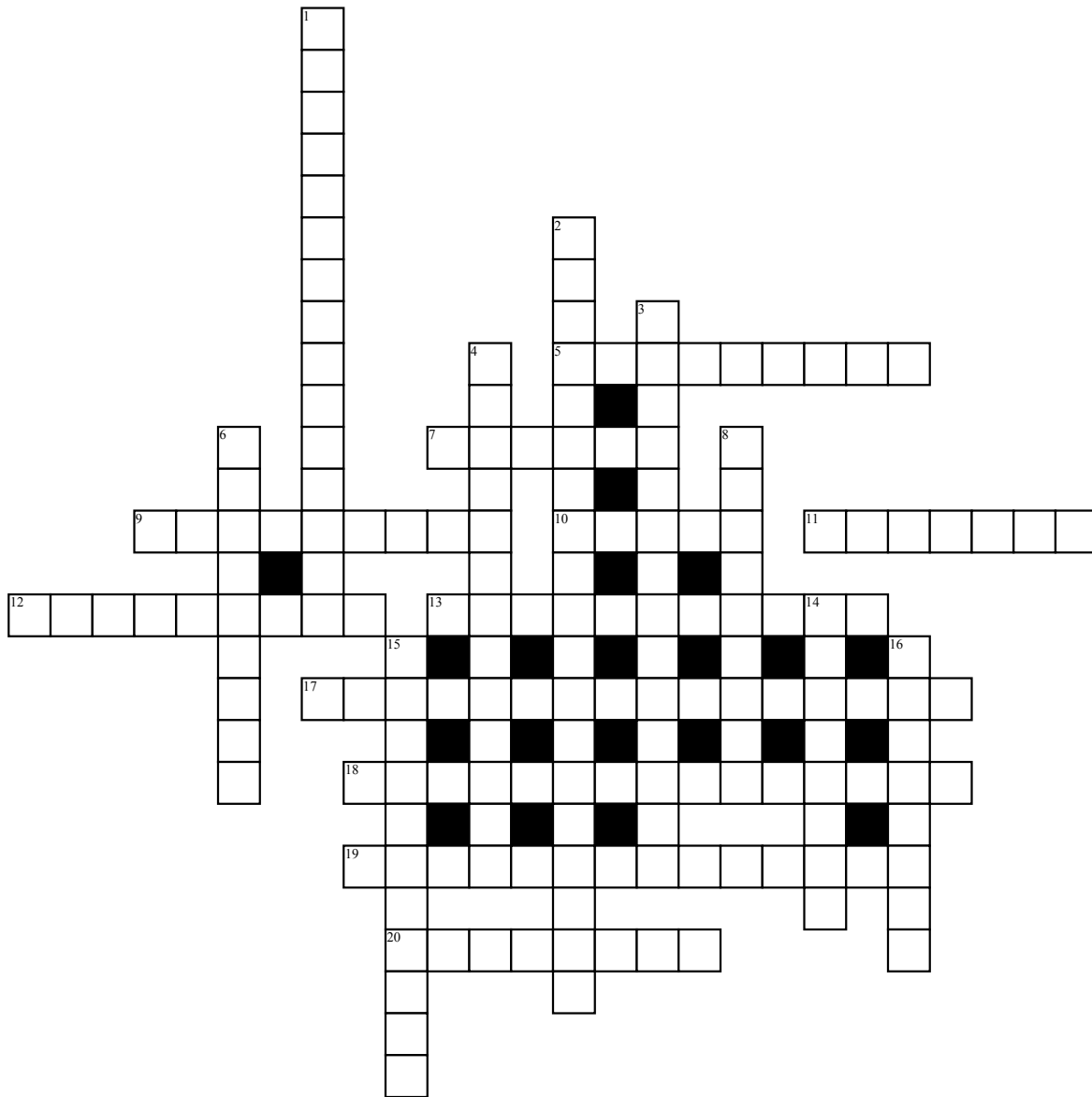


Napoleon and French Revolution Crossword Puzzle

- 9.** The political and social system that existed in France before the French Revolution
- 10.** a secondary school in France that is funded by the government.
- 11.** people who leave their native country for political reasons, like the nobles and others who fled France during peasant uprisings
- 12.** a wave of senseless panic that spread through the French countryside after the storming of the Bastille in 1789

13. marked the period between Napoleon's return from exile on the island of Elba to Paris on 20 March 1815

17. French Congress established by representatives of the Third estate on June 17, 1781

18. a pledge made by the members of France's National Assembly in 1789

19. an assembly of representatives from all three of the estates

20. an act or means of sealing off a place to prevent goods or people from entering or leaving.

1. the last Queen of France before the French Revolution.

2. a French congress with the power to create laws and approve declarations of war, established by the Constitution of 1791.

3. the French civil code established under Napoléon I in 1804

4. a period of remorseless repression or bloodshed, in particular Reign of Terror, the period of the Terror during the French Revolution

6. a sudden and decisive action in politics, especially one resulting in a change of government illegally or by force.

8. Became king in 1774, inherited part of the debt from the predecessors

14. a French soldier who served in the French Army. He was the son of Jérôme Napoléon Bonaparte and Susan May Williams

15. a French lawyer and politician, one of the best known and most influential figures associated with the French Revolution

16. fought on Sunday, 18 June 1815, near Waterloo in present-day Belgium, then part of the United Kingdom of the Netherlands
