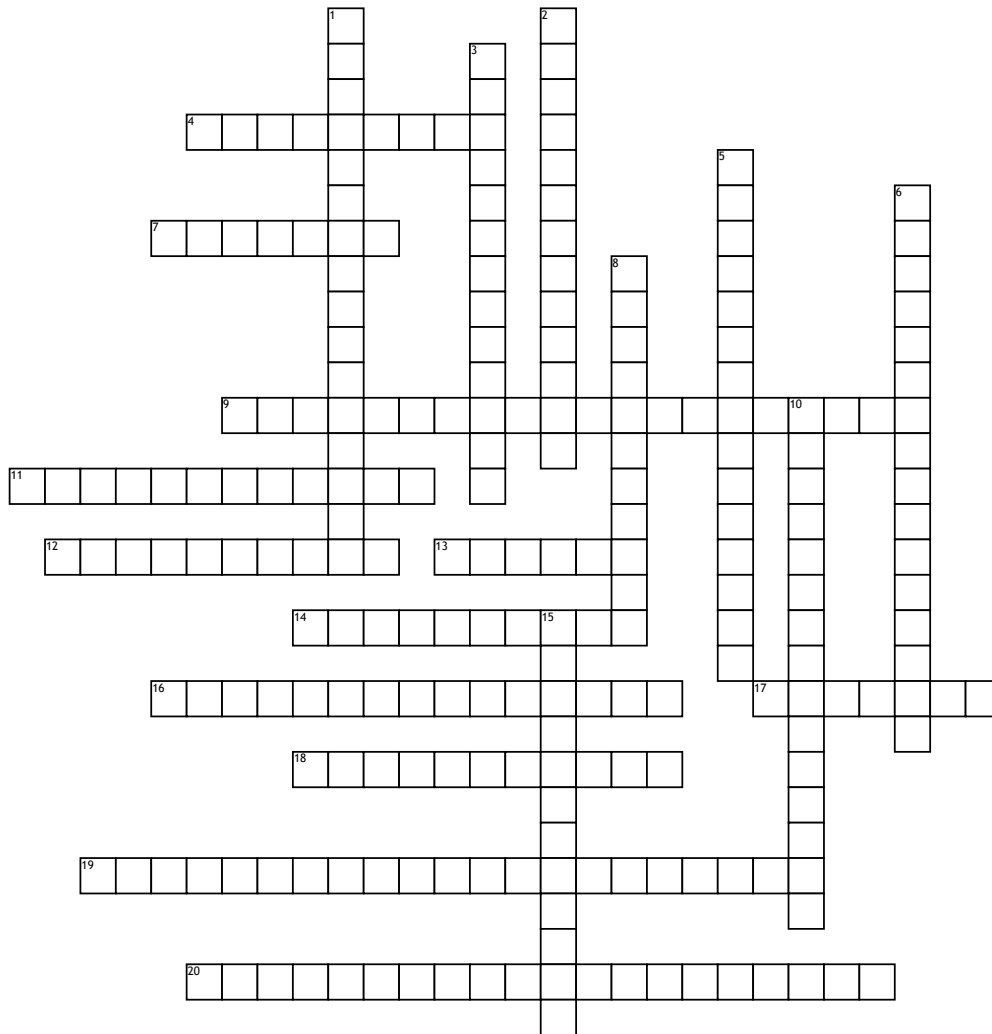


# New Deal



**Across**

- 4. Standards Act creates the right to a minimum wage, and "time-and-a-half" overtime pay when people work over forty hours a week. It also prohibited most employment of minors in "oppressive child labor".
- 7. act of 1935 Roosevelt signed on August 23, completed the restructuring of the Federal Reserve and financial system begun during the Hoover administration
- 9. Administration that raised the standard of rural living and to slow the extensive migration of rural Americans to urban centers
- 11. Administration that stressed "rural rehabilitation" efforts to improve the lifestyle of very poor landowning farmers, and a program to purchase sub-marginal land owned by poor farmers and resettle them in group farms on land more suitable for efficient farming
- 12. 1933 Act designed to correct the imbalance. impact on debt slavery and sharecropping In debt slavery, offered farmers money to produce less cotton in order to raise prices.
- 13. Act guarantees the right of workers to organize and outlines the legal framework for labor union and management relations.

- 14. Administration established by the New Deal during the Great Depression in the United States to rapidly create manual-labor jobs for millions of unemployed workers.
- 16. Act passed during the Great Depression in order to make housing and home mortgages more affordable.
- 17. Act that raised United States individual income tax rates marginally on higher incomes.
- 18. Adjustment Act 1938 was enacted as an alternative and replacement for the farm subsidy policies, in previous New Deal farm legislation, that had been found unconstitutional.
- 19. Commission established in 1934 to regulate the commerce in stocks, bonds, and other securities
- 20. Corps that a public work relief program that operated from 1933 to 1942 for unemployed, unmarried men.

**Down**

- 1. and Domestic Allotment Act federal law that allowed the government to pay farmers to reduce production so as to conserve soil and prevent erosion.
- 2. Administration was established in 1935 by the United States government to combat the unemployment issues facing underprivileged youth in the United States after the Great Depression.

- 3. Administration that was the largest and most ambitious American New Deal agency, employing millions of people to carry out public works projects, including the construction of public buildings and roads.
- 5. Federal \_\_\_\_\_ Administration created by the law to provide relief support to nearly 5 million households each month.
- 6. Act that in March 9, 1933 was an act passed by the United States Congress in March 1933 in an attempt to stabilize the banking system.
- 8. Administration built large-scale public works such as dams, bridges, hospitals, and schools.
- 10. Authority created by congressional charter on May 18, 1933, to provide navigation, flood control, electricity generation, fertilizer manufacturing, and economic development to the Tennessee Valley, a region particularly affected by the Great Depression.
- 15. Administration that relocated struggling urban and rural families to communities planned by the federal government.
