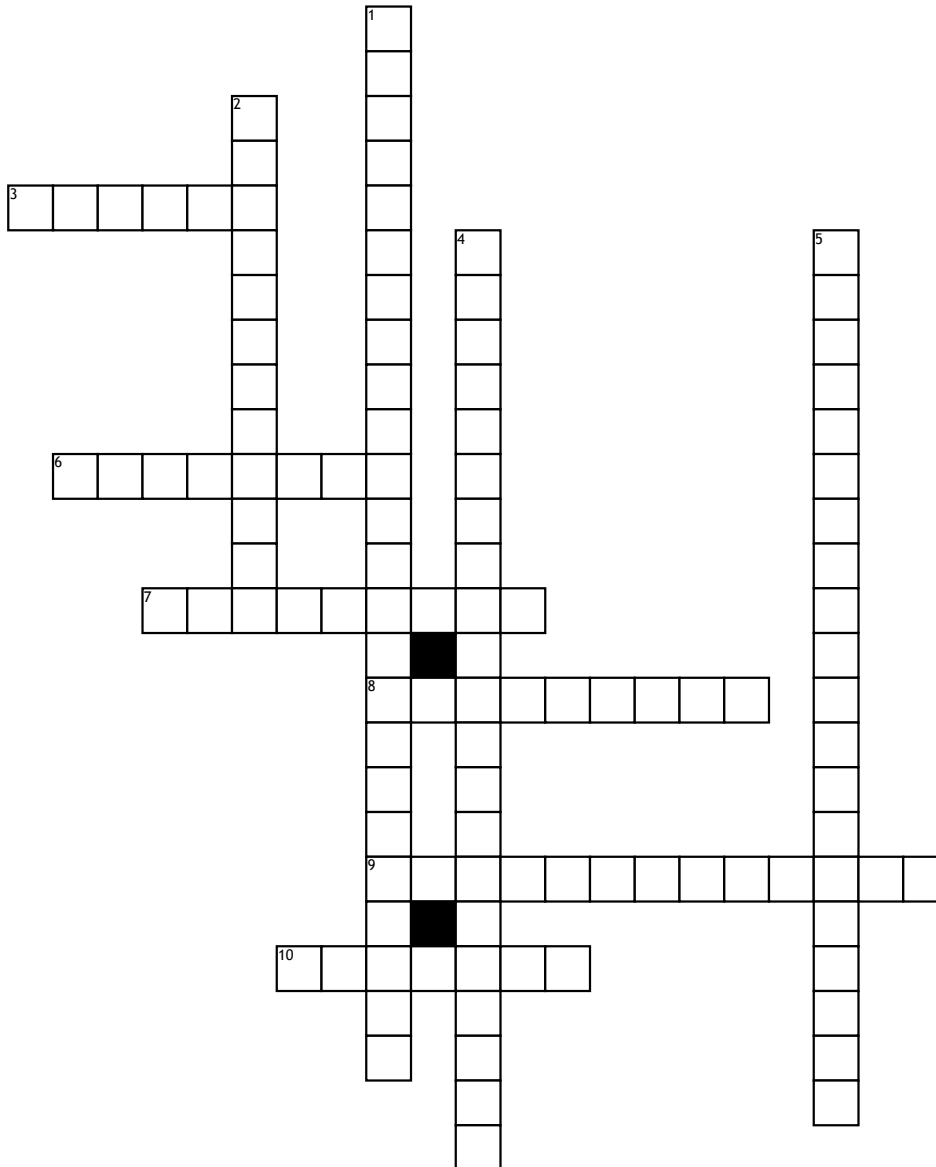

1. Explanation of behaviour that highlights the importance of the individual's personality.
2. A mental state where we feel no personal responsibility for our behaviour because we believe ourselves to be acting for an authority figure. Frees us from the demands of our consciences.
