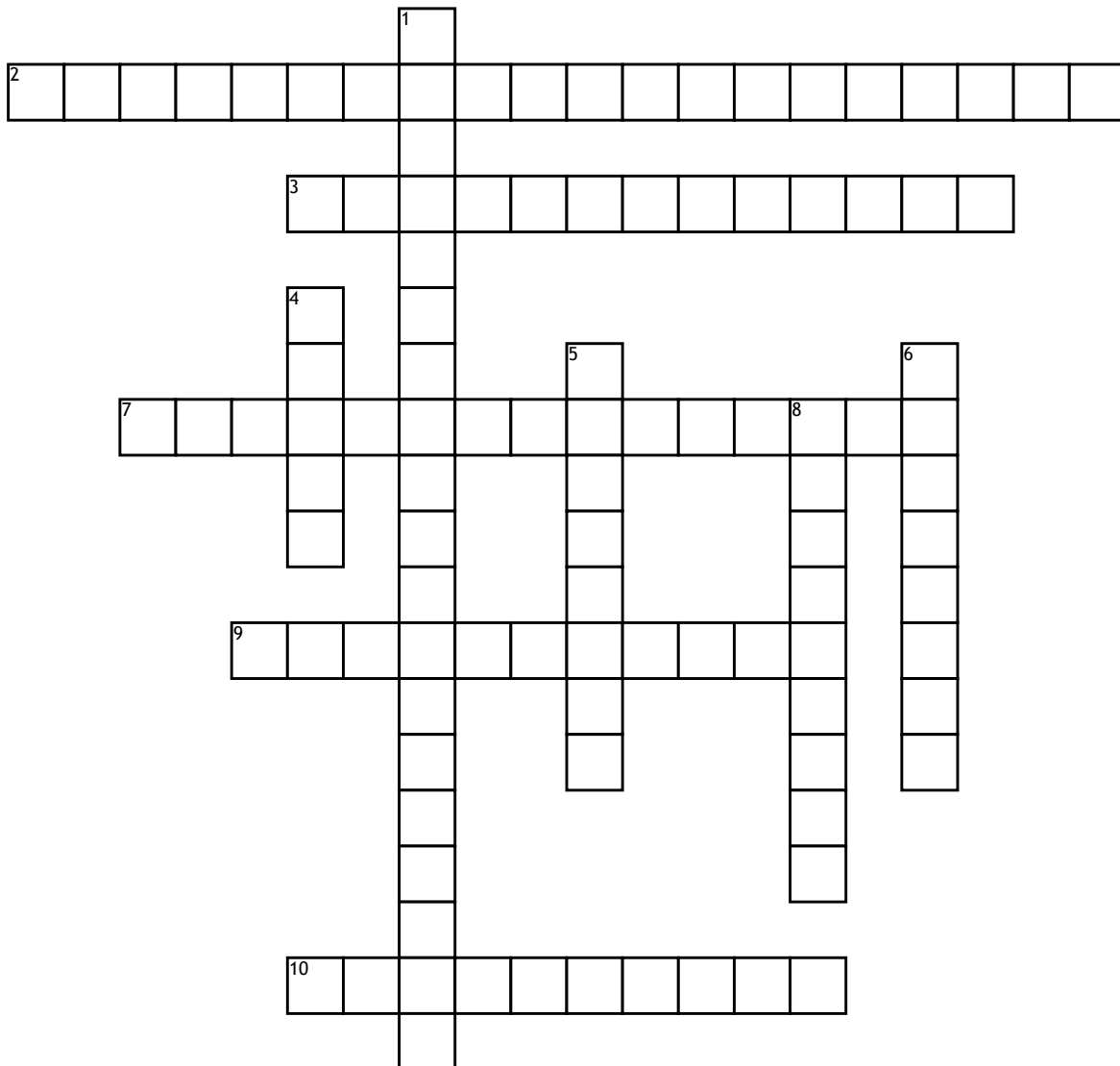

- 1. Impairment of thinking abilities including memory, judgment, reasoning, problem solving and decision making.
- 4. Swelling in body tissues caused by fluid accumulation
- 5. The loss of the ability to hear from one or both ears; can be mild, moderate, severe, or profound, due to illness, medication, noise exposure, or injury
- 6. A collection of symptoms caused by any of the several disorders of the brain; characterized by significantly impaired intellectual functioning that interferes with normal activities and relationships
- 8. The most common type of dementia in older people, in which thought, memory and language are impaired
