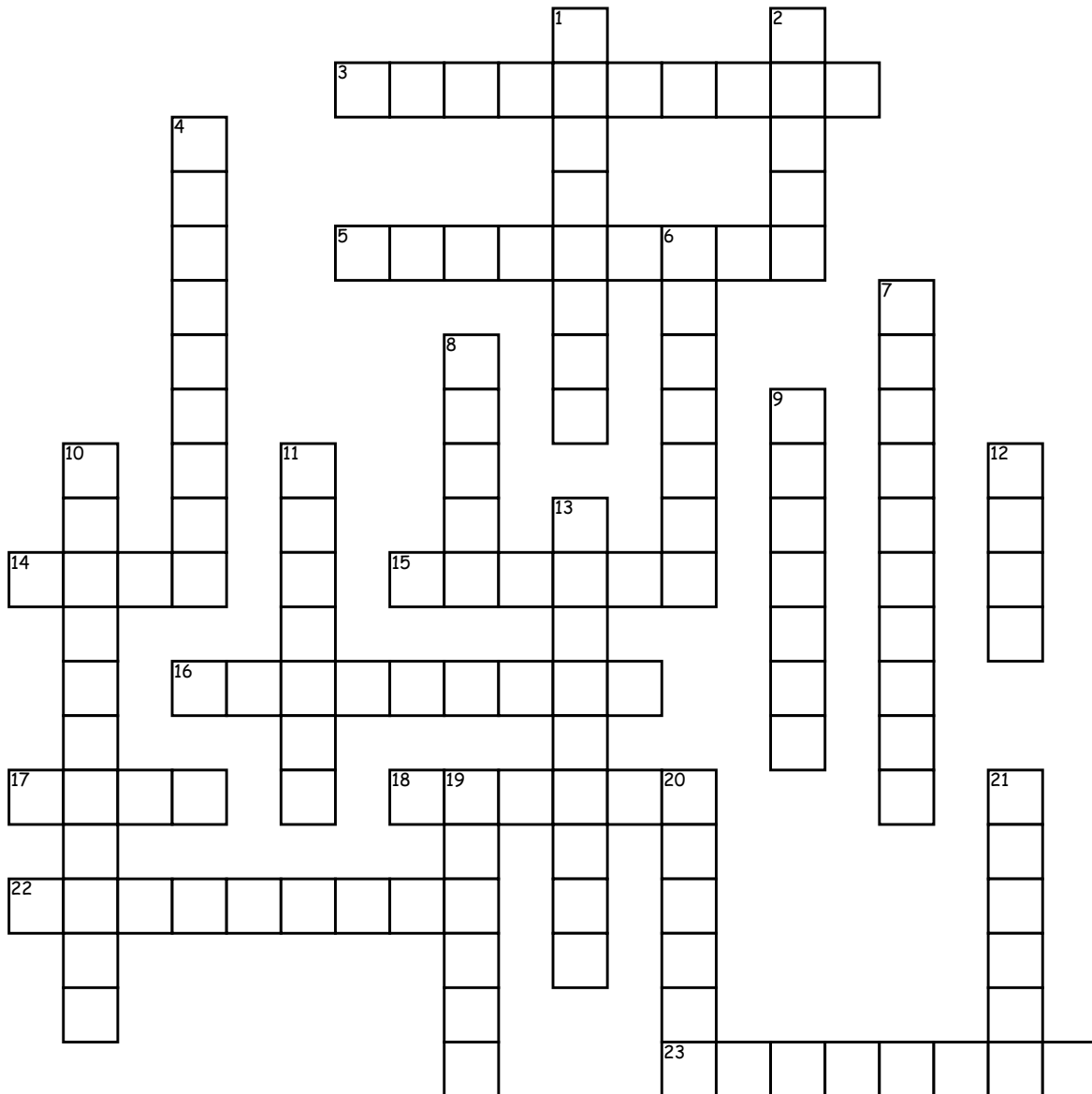


Papyrus' Perplexing Puzzle
