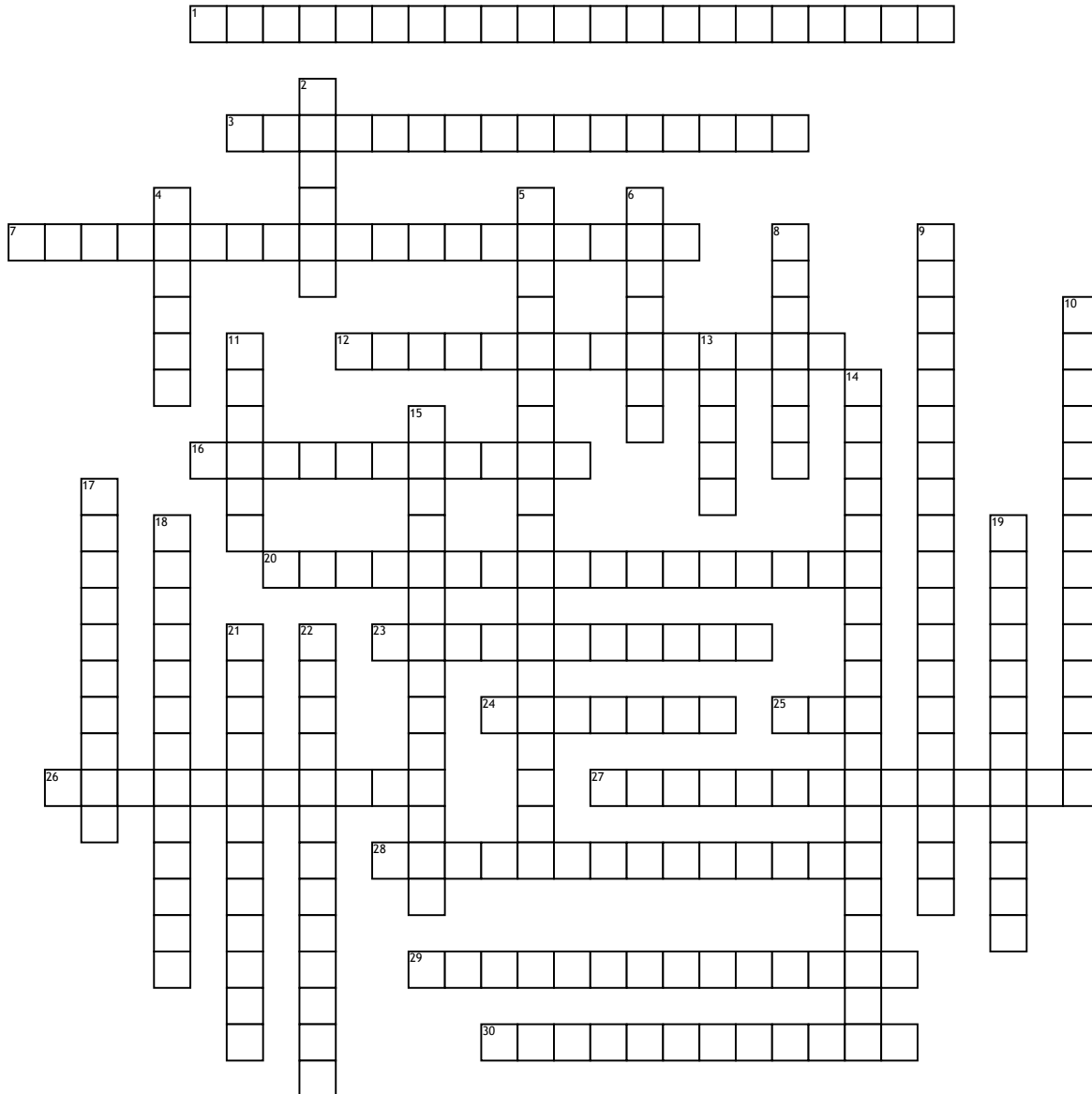


Parliament Crossword Puzzle - Sharko
