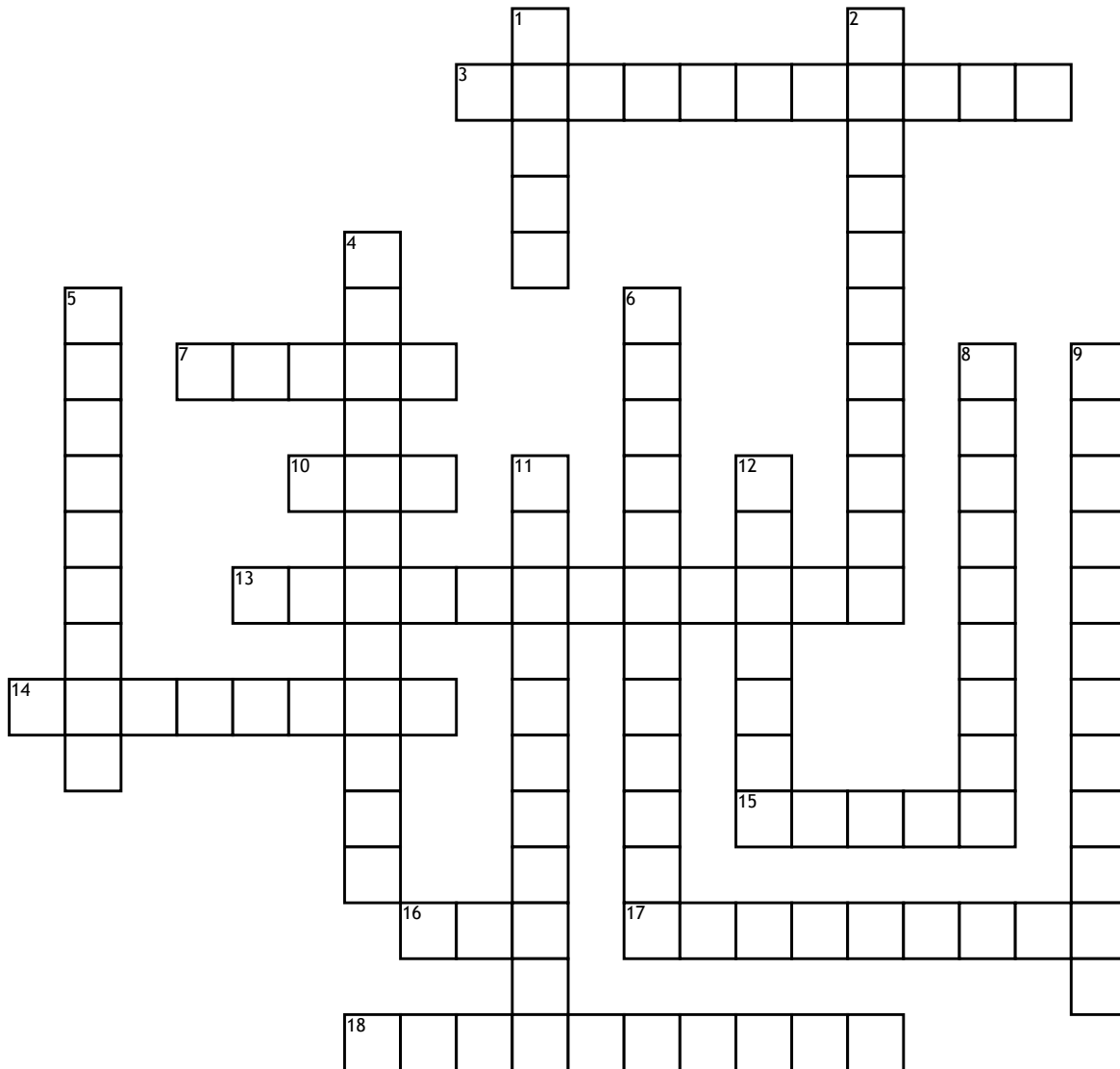

3. *Narthecium Ossifragum*
 7. In Celtic mythology, the visual effect of this tree trembling in the wind was said to be the tree communicating between this world and the next.
 10. Tree with black buds
 13. *Lepus Timidus*
 14. A fruit that grows on Heaths, and is the main ingredient for 'Mucky Mouth Pie'
 15. Also known as the 'Mountain Ash'
 16. Ordnance Survey, Harvey's or a type of Butterfly

17. Also known as the 'Moorcock' or 'Moorfowl'

18. A carnivorous plant that uses sticky, glandular leaves to lure, trap, and digest insects.

1. In some legends, it was an all-brown bird until it was touched with the blood of Christ as he hung on the Cross.
 2. Small wader, also known as 'horse gowk', and 'heather bleat'.
 4. Invasive Species introduced into the UK in the 1870's

5. Yellow four-petalled flower, whose roots yield a red dye, and is used to make artists' colours.

6. In Icelandic folklore, the appearance of the first of its kind in country means that spring has arrived.

8. *Rhizocarpon geographicum*
 9. A hardy perennial flowering plant, or a route up to the Kinder plateau from Edale.

11. A small, brown, streaky bird, which is the most common songbird in upland areas, and in the breeding season it has a fluttering 'parachute' display flight.
