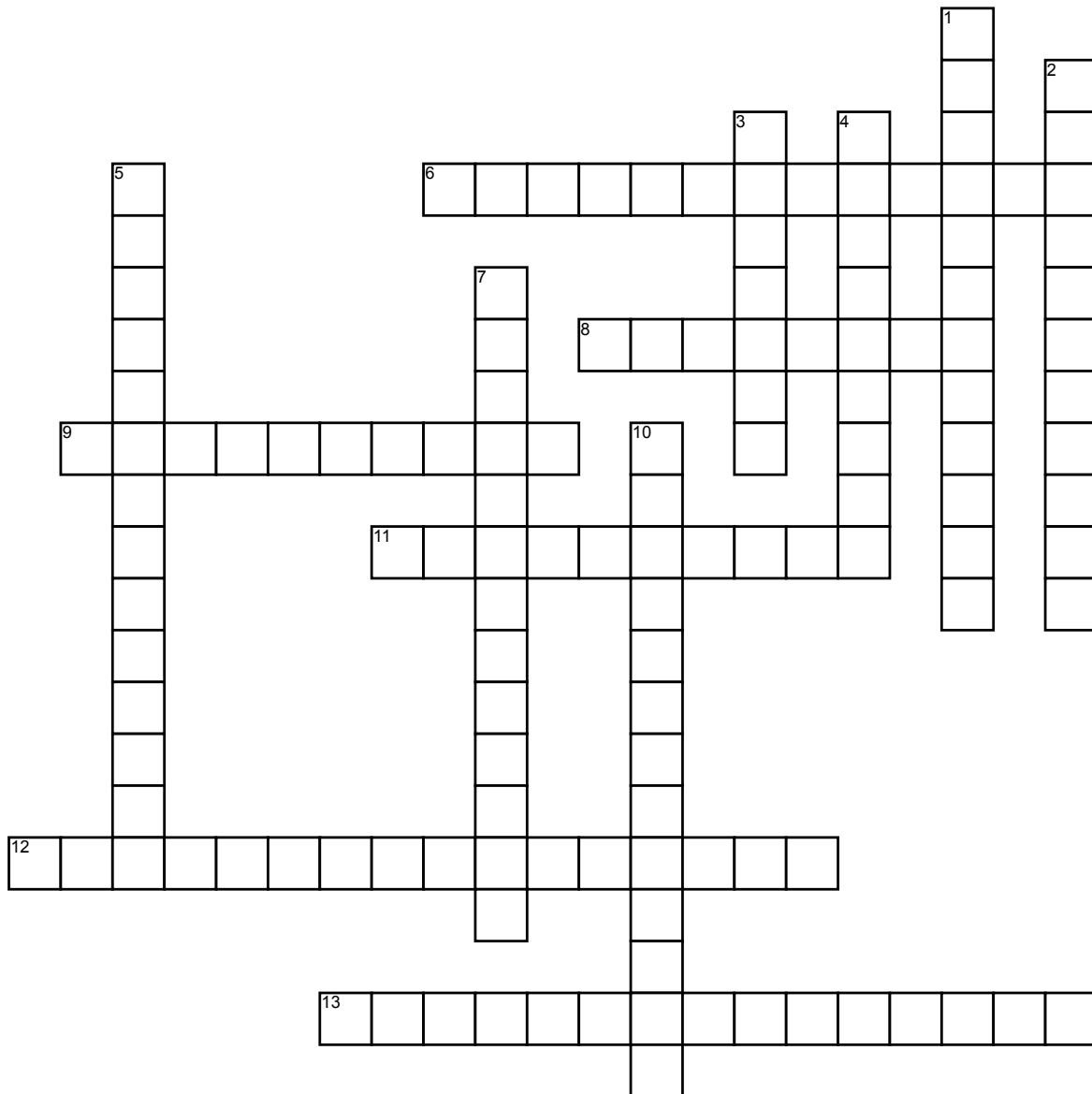


Perceptual Organization/Perceptual Interpretation

- 6.** Able to see things that are far and near, this sort of depth perception requires both eyes
- 8.** Organizing things and maintaining some organization with most stimuli
- 9.** Grouping similar figures together
- 11.** perceiving smooth continuous patterns rather than discontinuous ones

- 12.** The differences between visual images that each eye perceives due to different angles in which each eye views the world
- 13.** Judging the distances of objects allowing us to see them in three dimensions
- ## **Down**
- 1.** Organizing information about what they see, hear etc
- 2.** A test that is given to infants to see if they have developed depth perception

- 3.** Filling gaps to create a complete, whole object
- 4.** Grouping nearby figures together
- 5.** Distant objects are seen or portrayed as being smaller and higher in relations to items that are closer
- 7.** Perception of uniform or linked spots, lines or areas as a single unit
- 10.** Depth that can be detected by one eye instead of two
