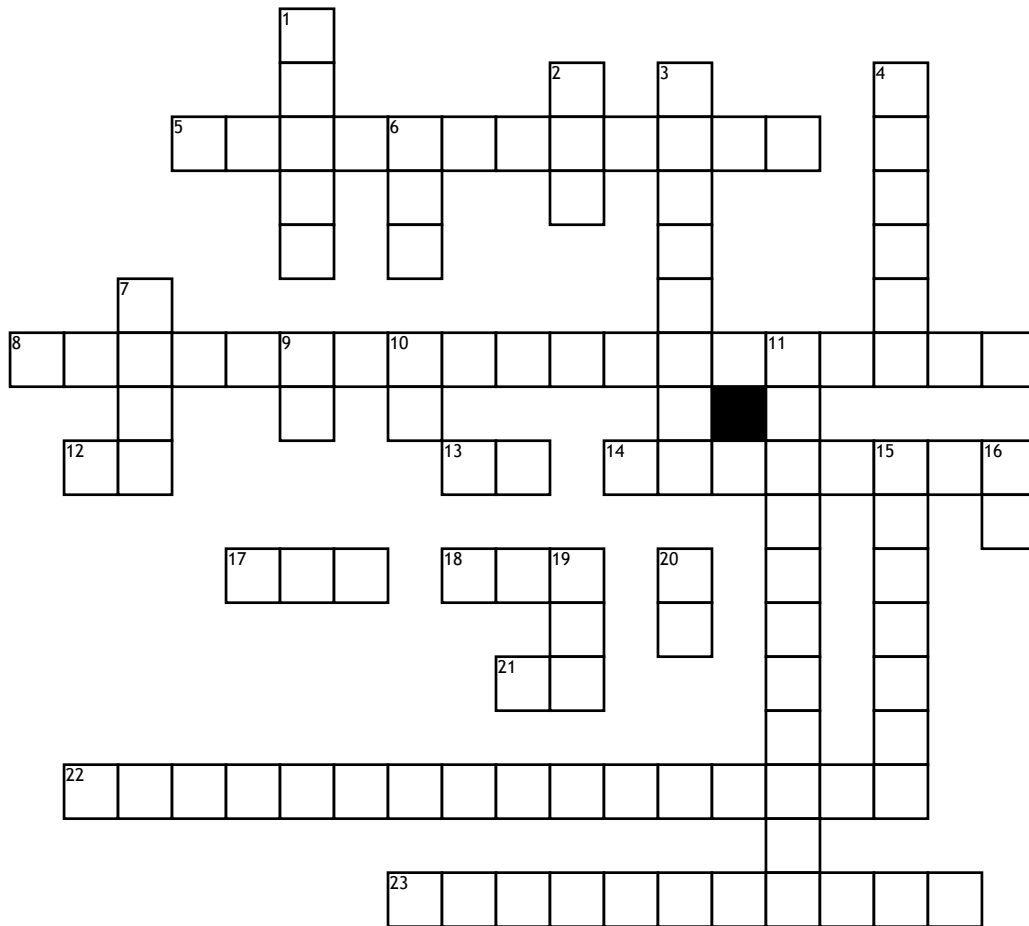


# Phakomatoses



**Across**

- 5. Blood finding in AT
- 8. Risk of intraocular surgery in SWS
- 12. Associated with increased susceptibility to respiratory infections
- 13. AR disorder
- 14. Most characteristic eye finding of NF-2
- 17. "Tomato catsup" fundus
- 18. Characterized by cerebral calcification and seizures

- 21. Mulberry phakoma
- 22. Adrenal tumor seen with VHL
- 23. AV malformations bleed but do not leak

**Down**

- 1. Iris nodules in NF-1
- 2. Angioma with leaky capillaries
- 3. Most common ocular complication in SWS
- 4. Most characteristic ocular complication of NF-1
- 6. Frequently presents with tinnitus and hearing loss

- 7. MR, seizures, and facial angiofibromas
- 9. "ROP" like retinal changes
- 10. Poor ability to initiate saccades
- 11. Cardiac tumor seen with TS
- 15. Retinal lesion seen in VHL
- 16. Retinal phakoma
- 19. Not genetically transmitted; somatic mutation
- 20. X-linked dominant disorder
