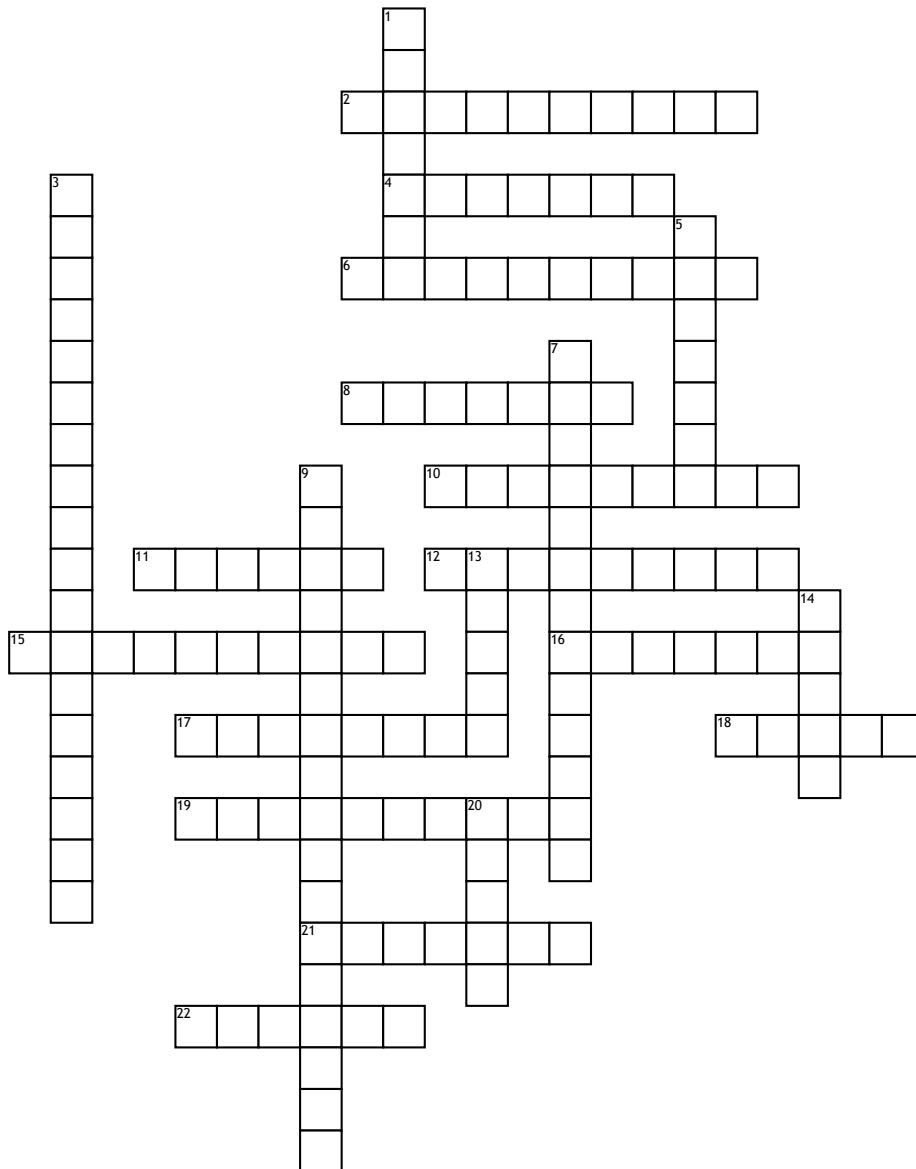

11. Blood vessel carrying oxygen-rich blood away from the heart.
12. The freeing of hemoglobin from within the red blood cells into the blood plasma.
15. A band wrapped tightly around the arm to stop the flow of blood to a distal part.

16. The sugar in blood that our body makes from food.

17. Tissue that is filled with blood caused by a break in the wall of a blood vessel.

18. A measurement used for the diameter of a needle. The larger the needle diameter, the smaller the gauge.

19. The oxygen carrying protein of red blood cells.

21. Fainting or a temporary loss of consciousness.

22. The fluid or liquid portion of the blood.
