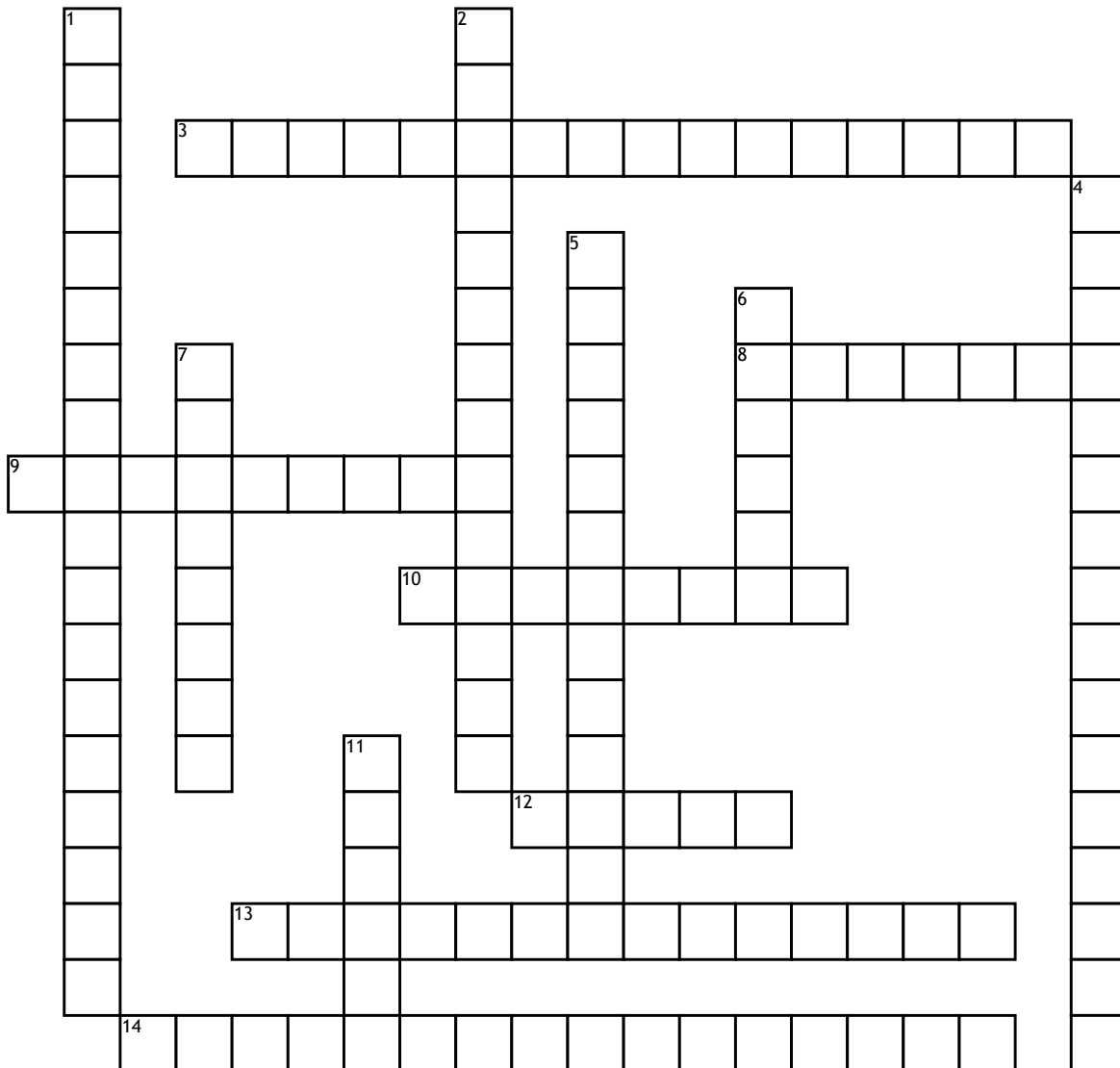


Phonics Terms

3. Two consonant letters with a single sound different from that of either of the letters: sh, ch, wh, th, ph
 8. A term that includes both prefixes and suffixes
 9. A letter that is not a vowel
 10. Putting phonemes together to form a word
 12. A diacritic mark (`) put over a vowel to indicate it has a "short" sound

13. Syllable that ends in a consonant sound, such as the second syllable in ho-tel
 14. Endings added to words to change where in sentences they are used. The most common s, ing, ed, ly, and er/est

1. Suffix that changes the word meaning, the new word has a separate dictionary entry. The most common of these include less, ful, and er

2. Two or more consonants in which you can hear both sounds blended such as blend, squall, scrub, burst
 4. Another term for consonant blends
 5. Combination of two words
 6. a diacritic mark (-) put over a vowel to indicate it has the "long" sound
 7. A word to which prefixes and/or suffixes can be added
 11. To "figure out the pronunciation" of a word
