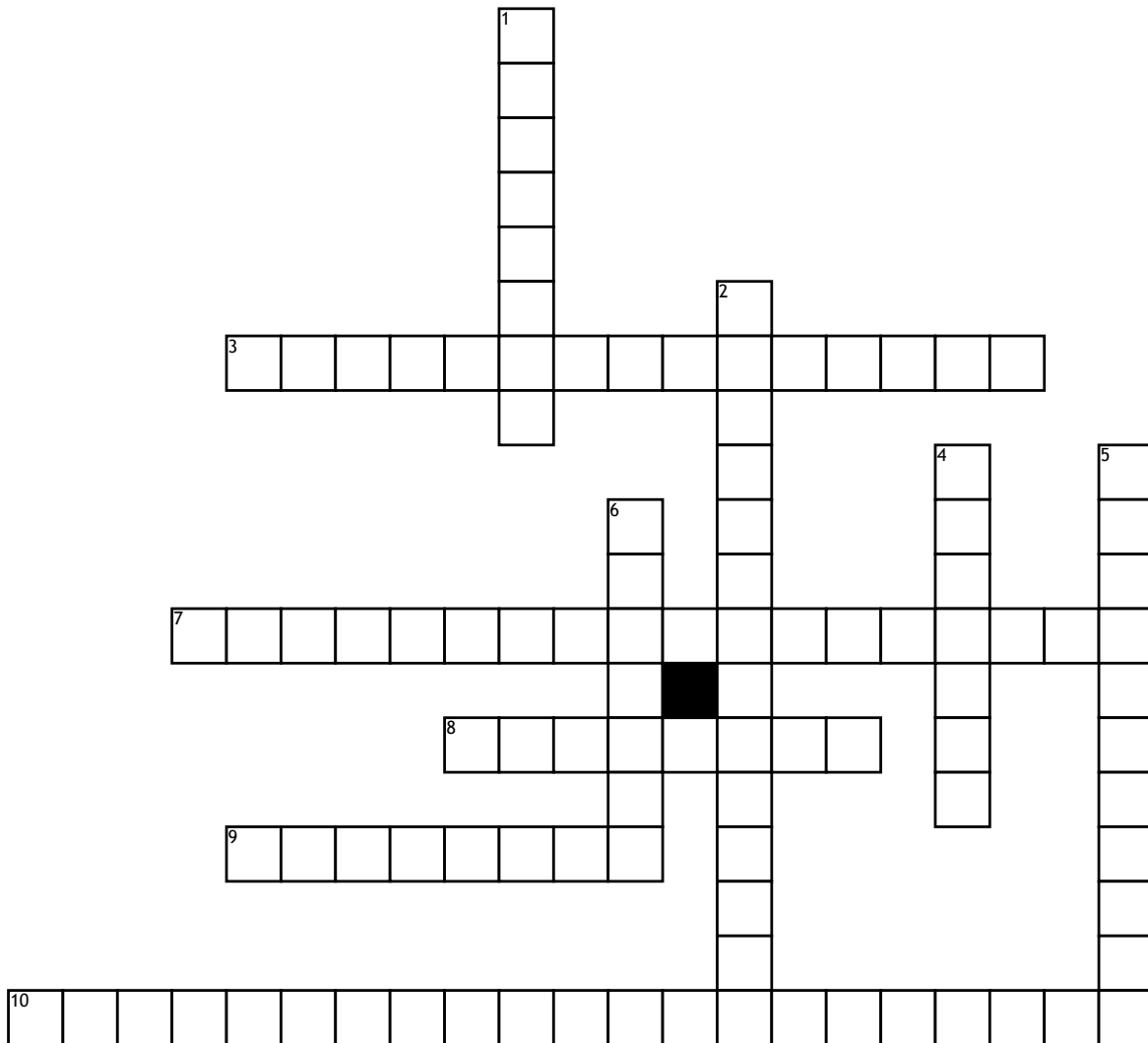

1. Requires that there must be consent or an informed agreement with the patient before any type of treatment can occur
2. Healthcare provider not intentionally cause injury or harm to the patient.
4. Moral obligation of the healthcare provider to be fair, equitable and equal to patients or individuals to claim what they are entitled to.
5. Healthcare providers have a duty to "do good", and be of a benefit to the patient they are treating.
6. Allows individuals to choose who has access to personal information, as well as what is done with that information.
