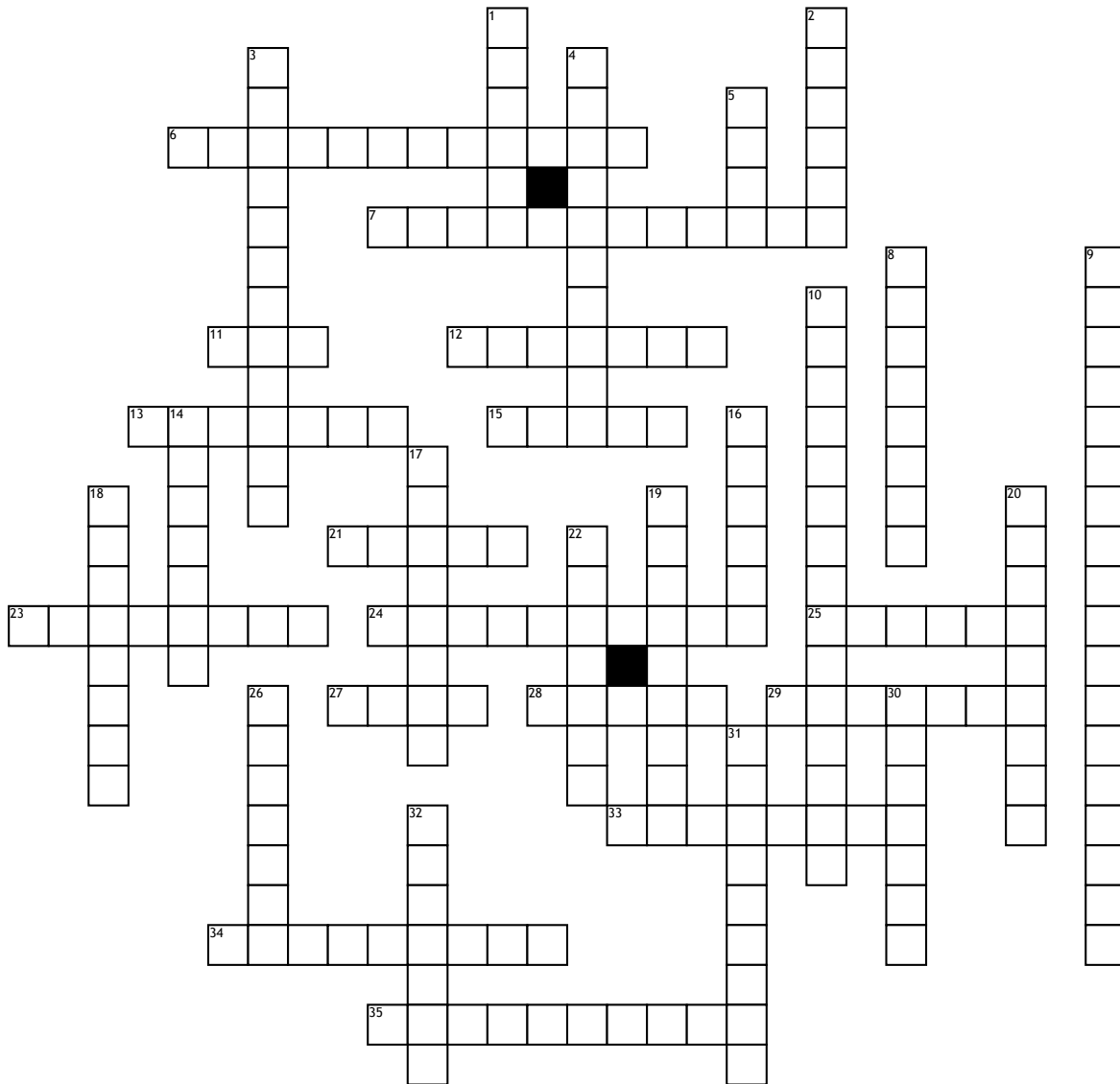


Poetic Devices

6. Is the repetition of initial consonant sounds
 7. The use of words which should like what they mean
 11. Is a form of poetry such as sonnet or elegy
 12. Having two successive rhyming lines in a verse and has the same meter to form a complete thought
 13. The choice and use of words and phrases in speech or writing
 15. Is the central idea of the story usually implied rather than directly stated
 21. Words that sound alike
 23. Is a verse with four lines, or even a full poem containing four lines
 24. The close repetition of identical consonant sounds before and after different vowels
 25. A foot containing unacceptable and short syllables followed by a long and accented syllables in a single line of a poem
 27. Is an element that evokes certain feeling or vibes in readers through words and descriptions
 28. Any regular pattern of rhythm based on unstressed syllables
 29. Is a pause in a line of poetry that formed by the rhythms of natural speech rather than by metrics
 33. In writing or speech, the deliberate repetition of the first part of the sentence in order to achieve an artistic effect

34. Is a close repetition of similar vowel sounds usually in stressed syllables
 35. Is the use of informal words, phrases or even slang in a piece of writing

1. A series of stressed or accented syllables in a group of words
 2. Is a division of four or more lines having a fixed length, meter or rhyming scheme
 3. Is a stylistic device in which several coordinating conjunctions are used in succession in order to achieve an artistic effect
 4. A figure of speech in which a person not present is addressed
 5. A figure of speech in which a word is used outside its literal meaning
 8. Is a direct or indirect reference to a familiar figure, place or event from history, literature, mythology or the Bible
 9. Is used in such a way as to force words of their literal meanings by emphasizing their connotations to bring new insight and feeling to the subject

 20. Is a meter as simple as possible it is a line of poetry composed to trochees
 22. Is a kind of metaphor that compares two very unlike things in a surprising and clever way
 26. A form of understatement in which something is said by denying the opposite
 30. The "voice" which seems to be telling the poem
 31. An exaggeration in the service of the truth, an overstatement
 32. A statement in which there is an apparent contradiction which is actually true
