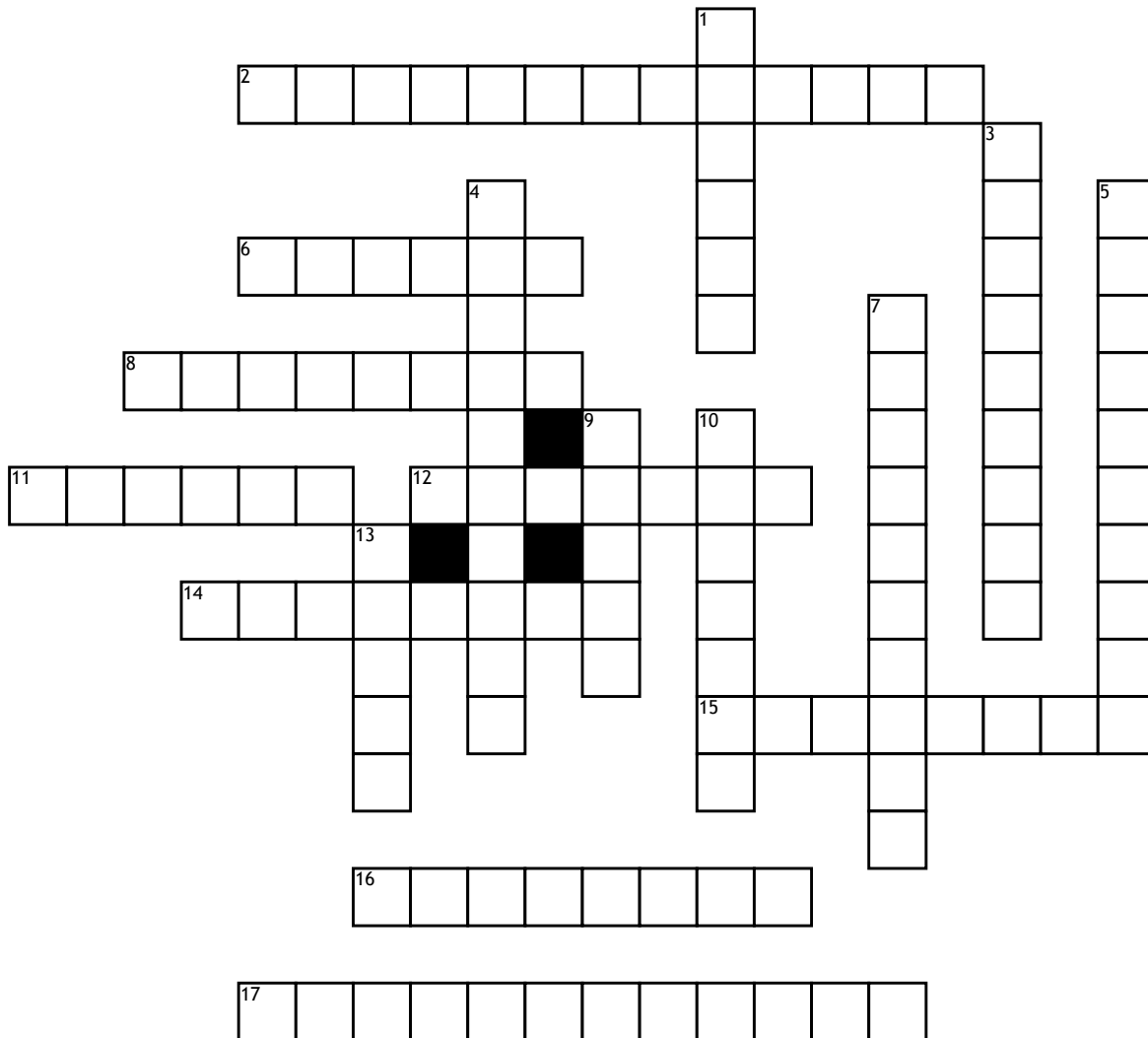


# Poetic Devices: Eng 10



## Across

2. Purposeful placing of two or more words closely together  
 6. Either Shakespearean or Petrarchan  
 8. Making reference to another literary character or work  
 11. Language or slang used only by a single grouping of people  
 12. Statement that contradicts itself but remains true

14. A comedic 5 line poem originating in Ireland  
 15. Similar sounds at the end of words that occur at the end of the poem's lines  
 16. Comparison not using "like" or "as"  
 17. Repeated initial sounds in a line of poetry

 1. Comparison using "like" or "as"  
 3. Repeated vowel sounds within 2 or more closely placed words

4. Literal meaning of the word contrasts with the associated meaning  
 5. Repeated consonant sounds within 2 or more closely placed words  
 7. A poem with no structure besides its lines being written in iambic pentameter  
 9. A poem with 3 lines and a syllable sequence of 5, 7, 5  
 10. The end rhyme of two lines one right after the other  
 13. The poetic beat
