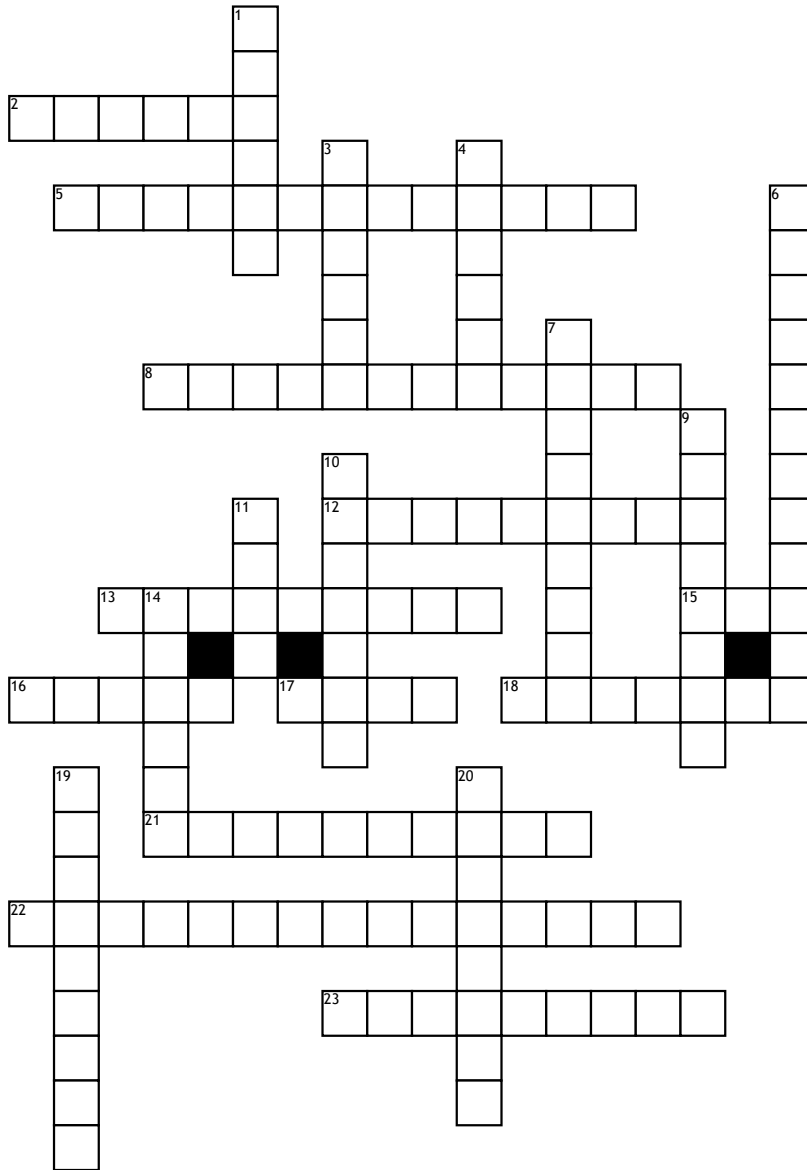


# Poetic Forms and Techniques
