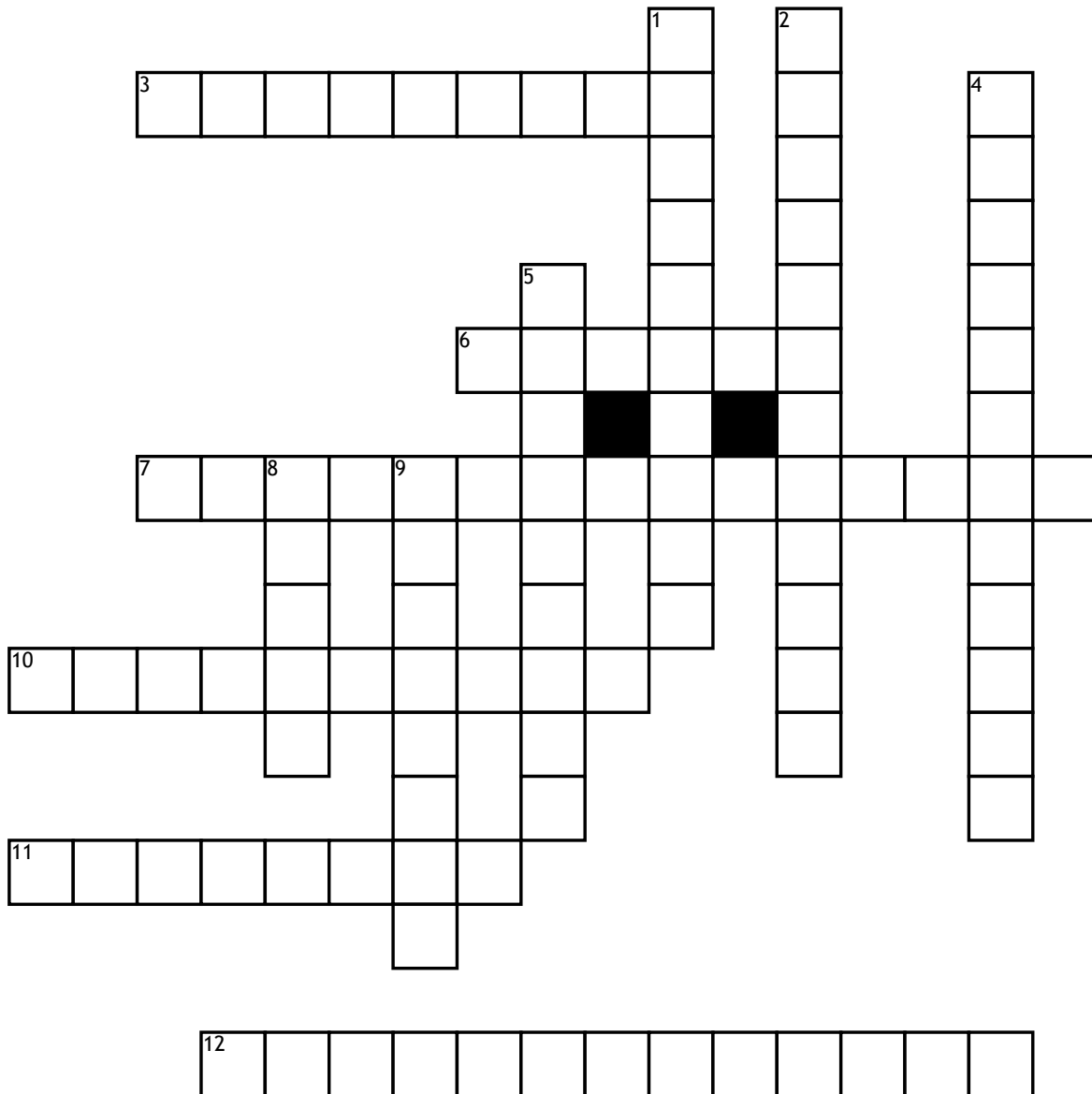


# Poetic devices



## Across

3. The repetition of similar vowel sounds  
 6. Where the writer compares 2 things using the words 'like' or 'as'.  
 7. Attributing human qualities or features to something non-human  
 10. the continuation of a sentence without a pause beyond the end of a line, couplet, or stanza.  
 11. Where two things are said to be the same.

12. the fact of two things being seen or placed close together with contrasting effect.

## Down

1. the action of repeating something that has already been said or written.  
 2. The repetition of the same letter at the beginning of a series of words. Eg. "Billy Brennan's Barn"  
 4. Words whose sound imitates their meaning. eg. "buzz, tinkle, rattle, stutter, whisper, bang"

5. A specific type of alliteration that relies on the repetition of soft consonant sounds in words to create a wooshing or hissing sound in the writing.  
 8. Similar sounds between words or the endings of words  
 9. a figure of speech in which apparently contradictory terms appear in conjunction (e.g. faith unfaithful kept him falsely true )
