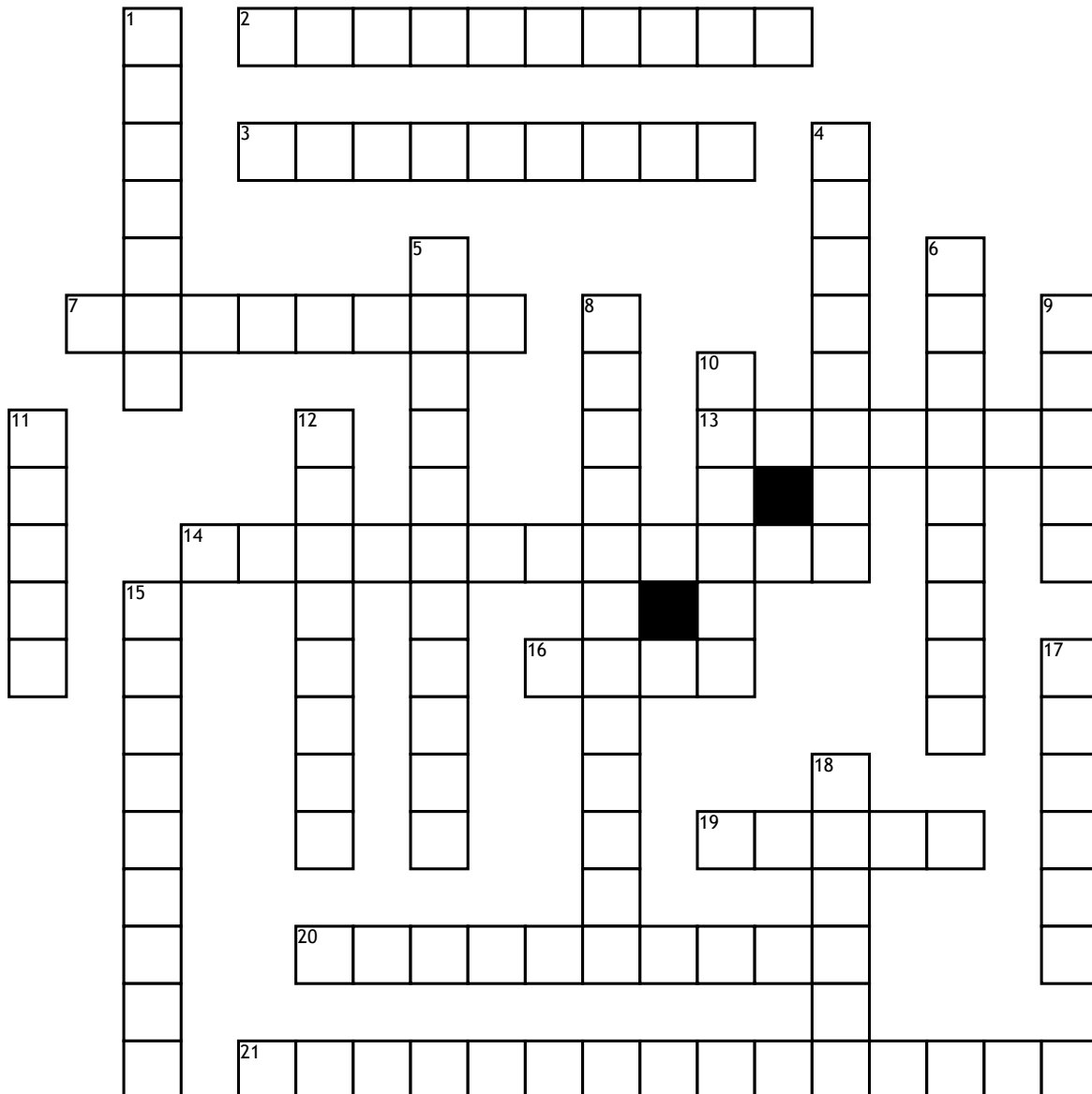


# Poetry Devices



## Across

2. repetition of consonant sounds in the middle or ends of words  
 3. repetition of vowel sounds in a line of poetry  
 7. a comparison between unlike things without using "like" or "as"  
 13. language which prompts the use of the senses to make comparisons  
 14. repetition of consonant sounds at the beginning of words  
 16. the attitude of the author toward the subject of a work  
 19. the measured pattern of rhythmic accents in a poem

20. the dictionary meaning of a word  
 21. giving inanimate objects or abstract concepts human or living qualities

1. a pair of rhymed lines that may or may not constitute a stanza  
 4. a four-line stanza in a poem
