8. Express or represent (something) by extravagant and exaggerated mime

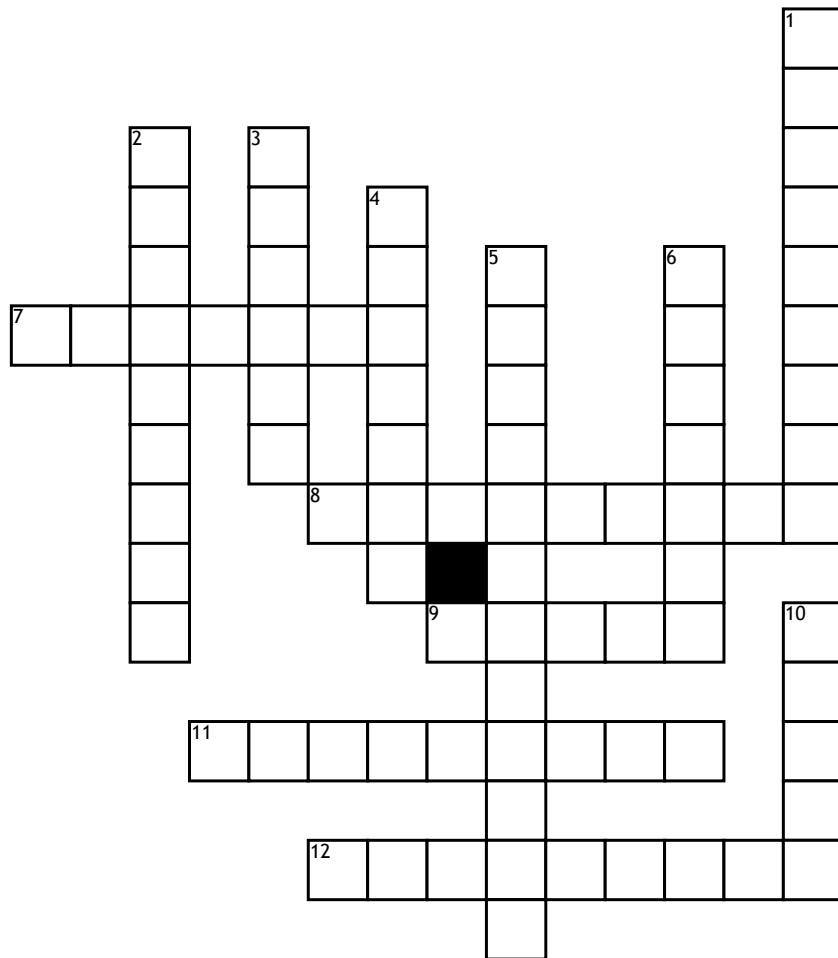
9. Written or spoken language in its ordinary form, without metrical structure

3. An imitation of the style of a particular writer, artist, or genre with deliberate exaggeration for comic effect

4. Represent (something) in graphic form

5. Occurrence of the same letter or sound at the beginning of adjacent or closely connected words

6. Exact, accurate, and careful about details
