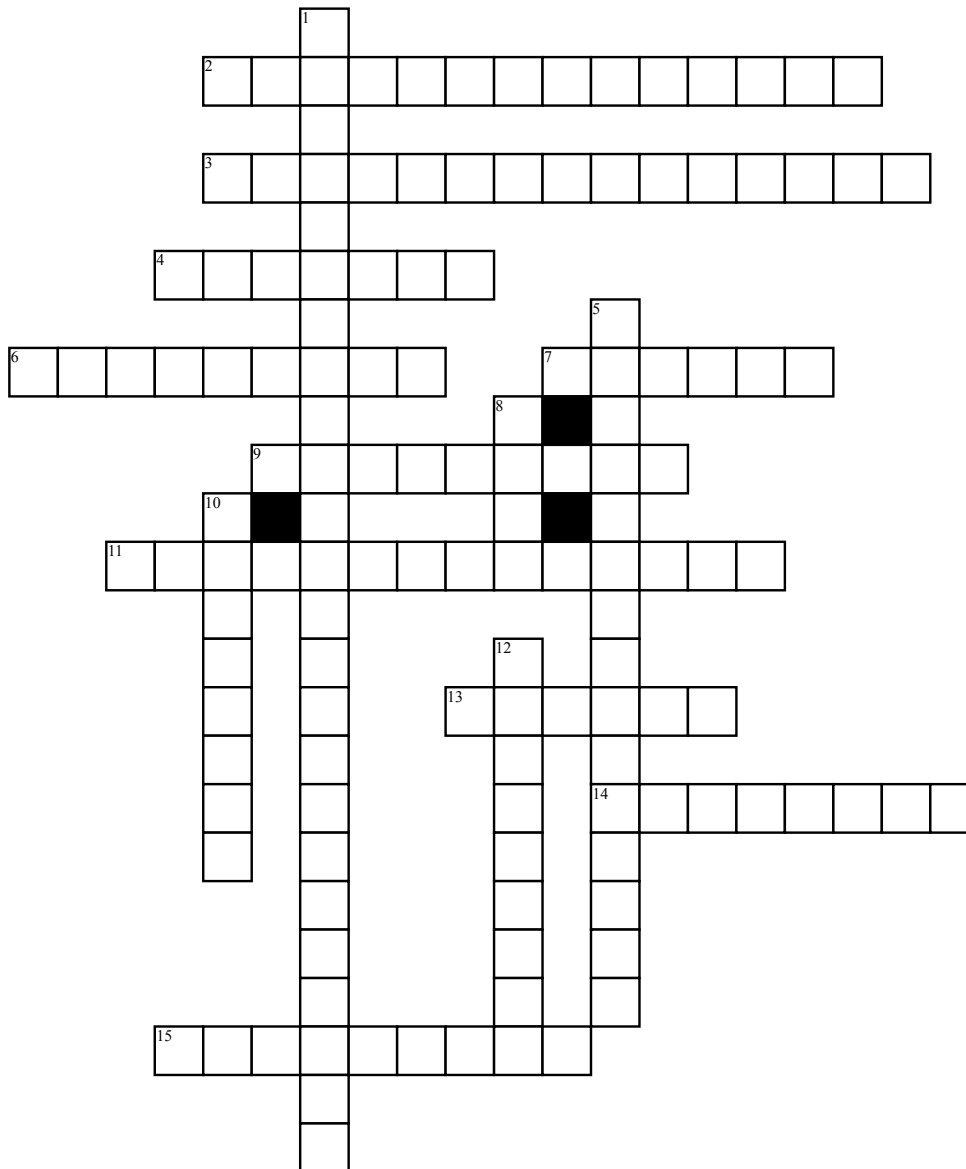


Political Behaviors

- 9. A specific type of asset-based loan financing through which a borrower receives funds secured by real property
- 11. A group of individuals with broad common interests who organize to nominate candidates for office, win elections, conduct government, and determine public policy

- 14. An organized course of action towards a goal
- 15. Campaign contributions unregulated by federal or state law, usually given to parties and party committees to help fund general party activities
