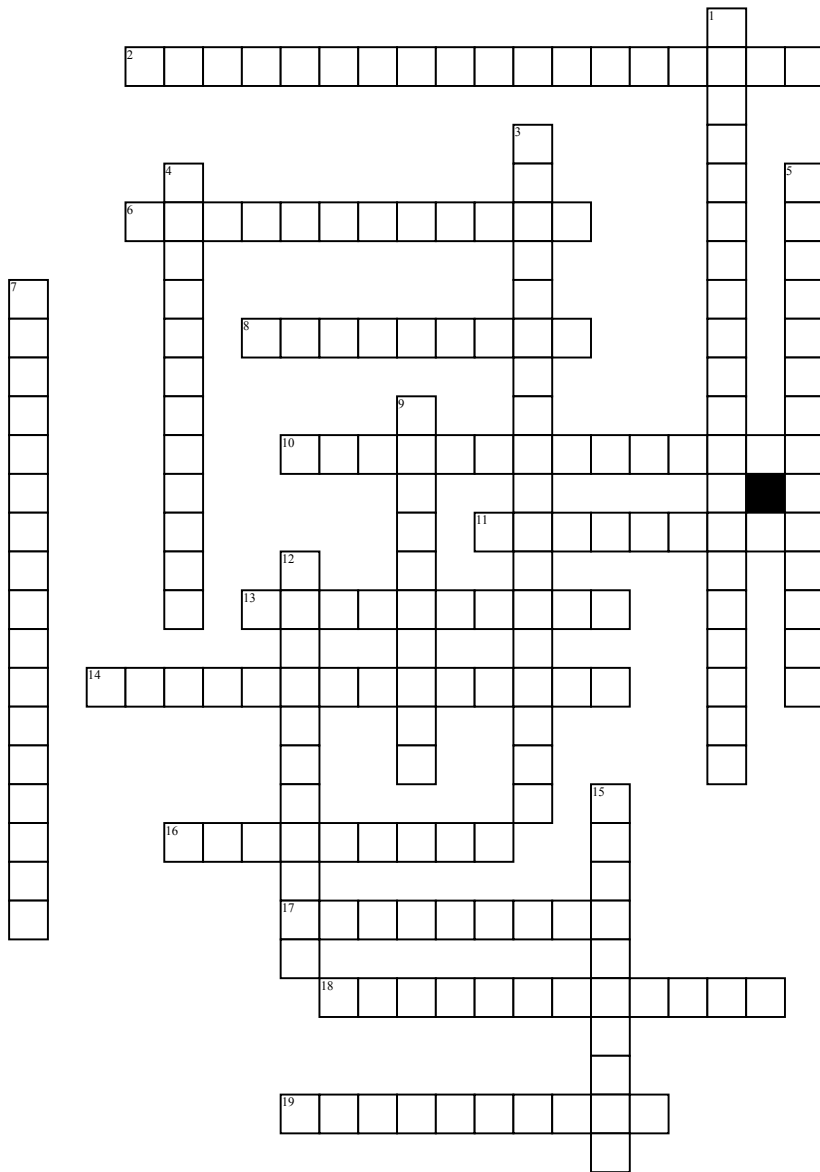


Political Parties

2. A political party that campaigns on only one issue.
 6. A political party that holds substantial influence in a country's politics, standing in contrast to a minor party.
 8. A temporary alliance of distinct parties, persons, or states for joint action
 10. An organized group of people who come together to contest elections and hold power in the government.
 11. A number of votes cast for a candidate in a contest of more than two candidates that is greater than the number cast for any other candidate but not more than half the total votes cast
 13. A body of people entitled to vote
 14. Where two major political parties dominate the government

17. The holder of an office or post.

18. A political party that has a close relationship with the executive branch of government such that the party appears to function as an extension of the executive rather than as an autonomous political organization.

19. A political party whose electoral strength is so small as to prevent its gaining control of a government except in rare and exceptional circumstances
