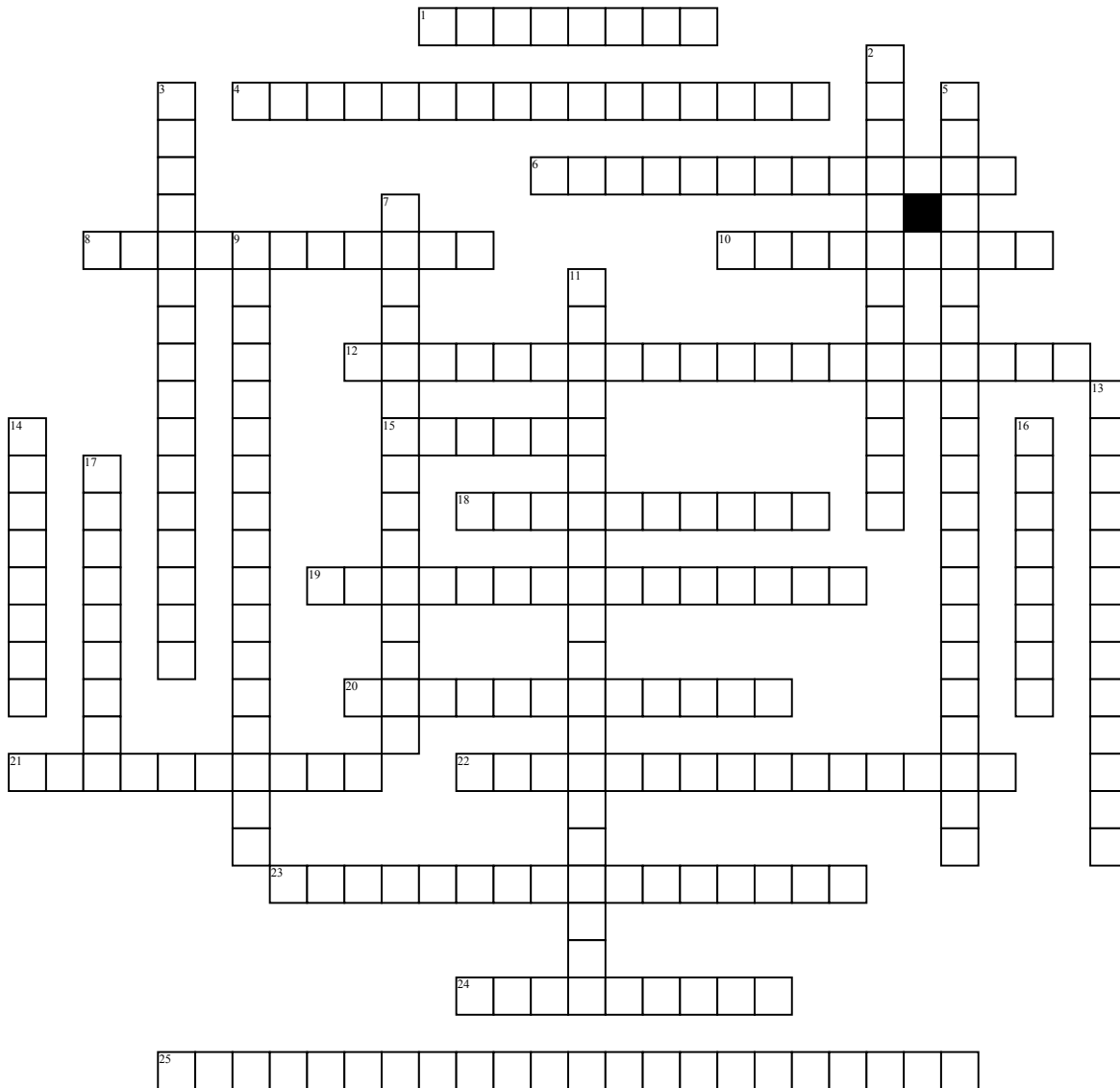

16. Interest groups that can spend unlimited amounts of money to promote or oppose a candidate as long as they don't coordinate with any candidate
