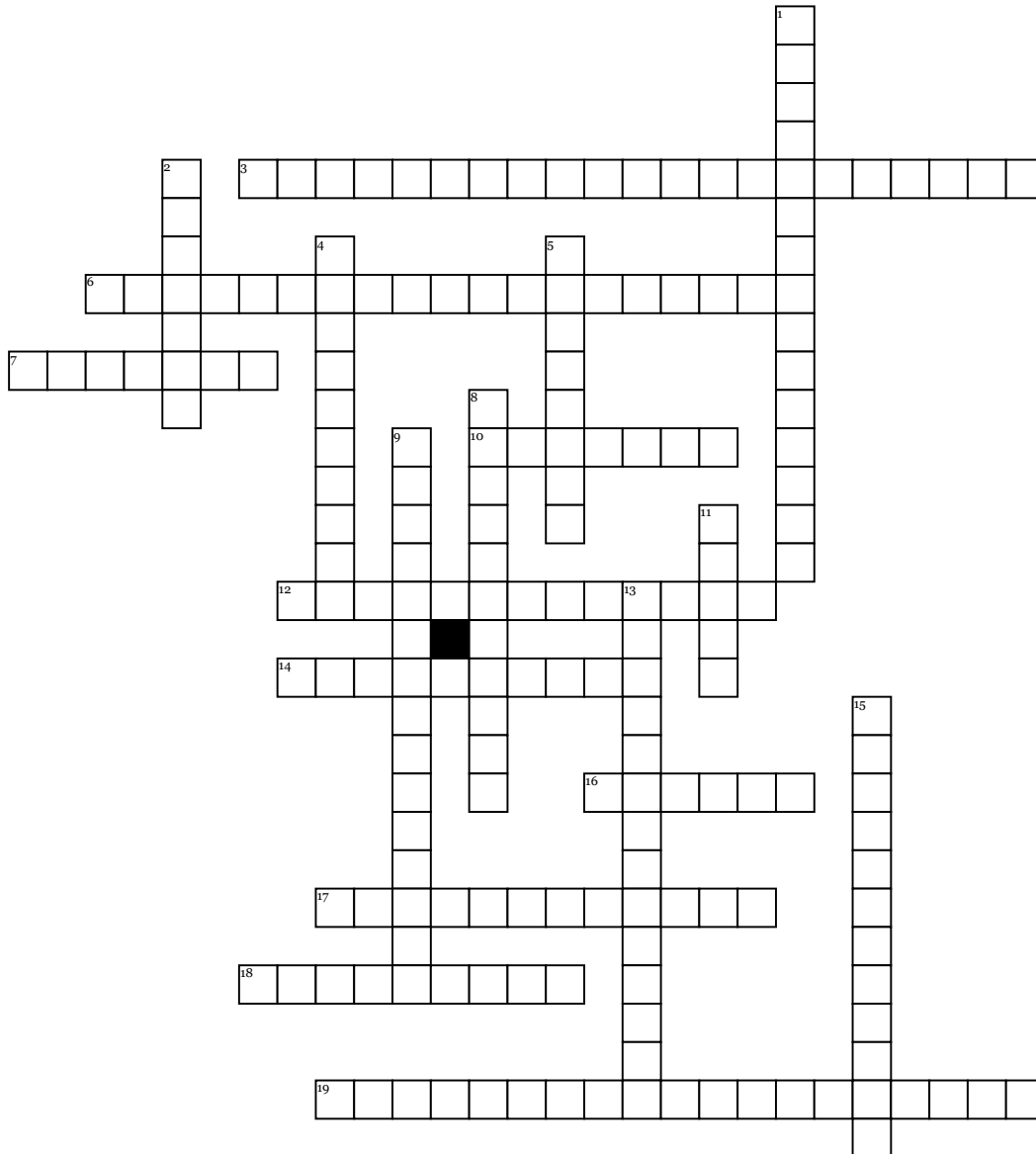

- 1.** Number of people under 15 and over 64 compared to the number of people active in the workforce
2. Someone forced to migrate from his or her home country and cannot return for fear of persecution due to race, religion, nationality, political opinion
4. Large-scale emigration by talented people

- 5.** Temporary movement of a migrant worker between home and host countries to seek employment
8. Migration to a new location
9. Degradation of land, primarily because of human actions such as excessive crop planting, animal grazing, and tree cutting
11. Migration of people to a specific location because relatives or members of the same nationality previously migrated there
13. The number of people in an area exceeds the environment's ability to support life at a decent standard of living
15. Someone who has migrated to another country in the hope of being recognized as a refugee
