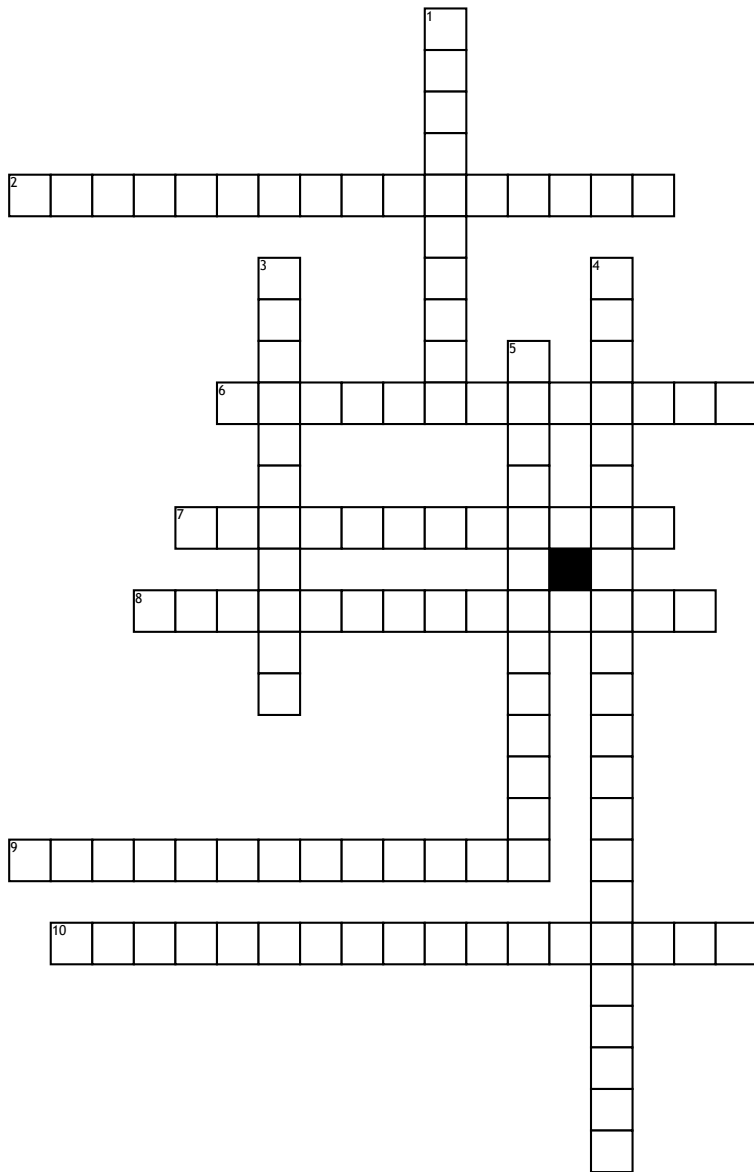


Population and Migration

- 2. the likelihood that as many as 25% of all migrants will return to their place of origin (return migration)
- 6. the effects of distance on interaction, generally the greater the distance the less interaction
- 7. A model that holds that the potential use of a service at a particular location is directly related to the number of people in a location and inversely related to the distance people must travel to reach the service.

- 8. the assemblage in one area of the relatives, friends or unconnected compatriots of the first arrivals; attracted by both favorable reports and by familiar presences in specific locales of the New World
- 9. area within which we move freely on our rounds of regular activity
- 10. Migration within a country
