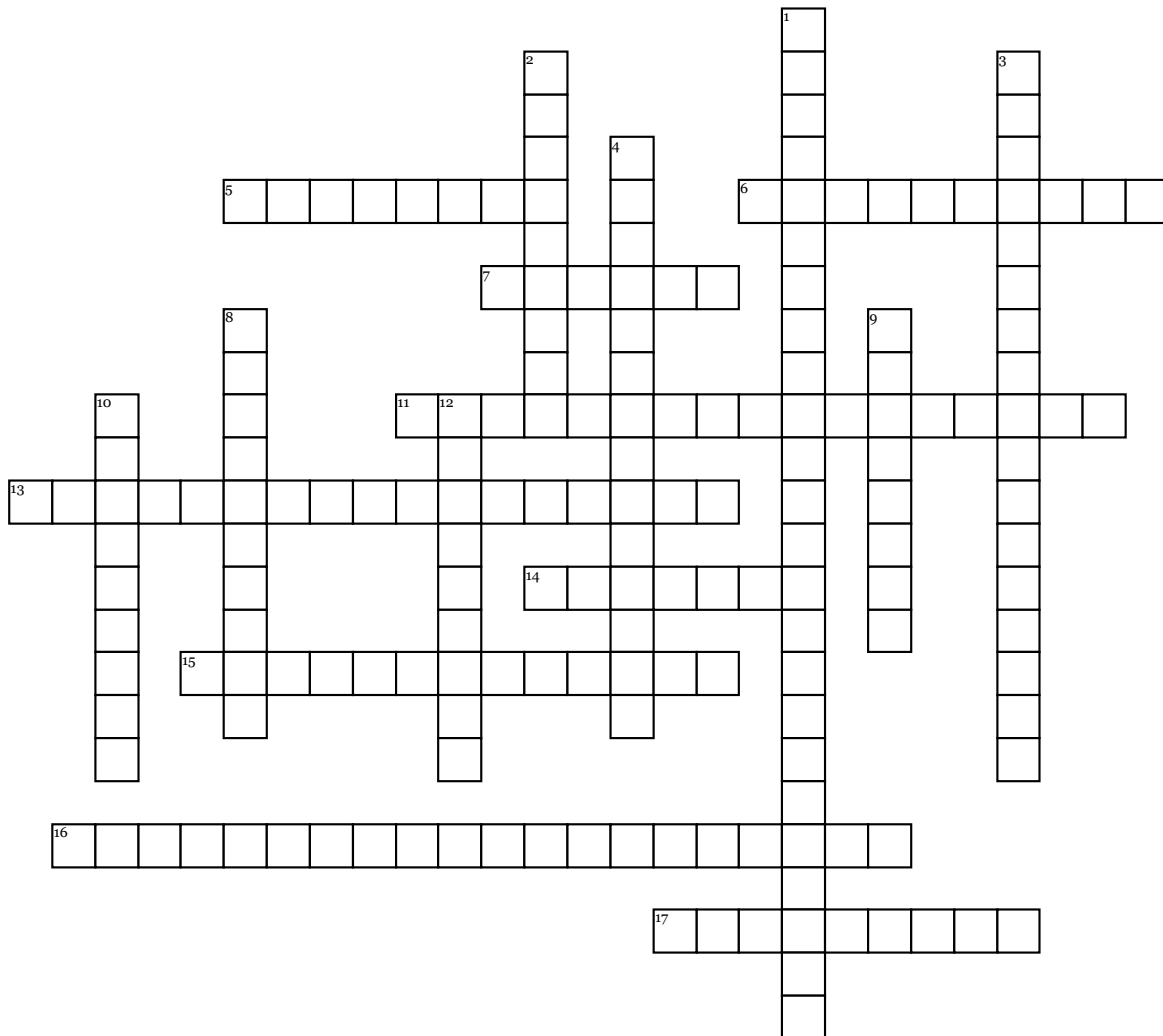

1. A government where people elect office holders to make laws and conduct government on their behalf (for them)
