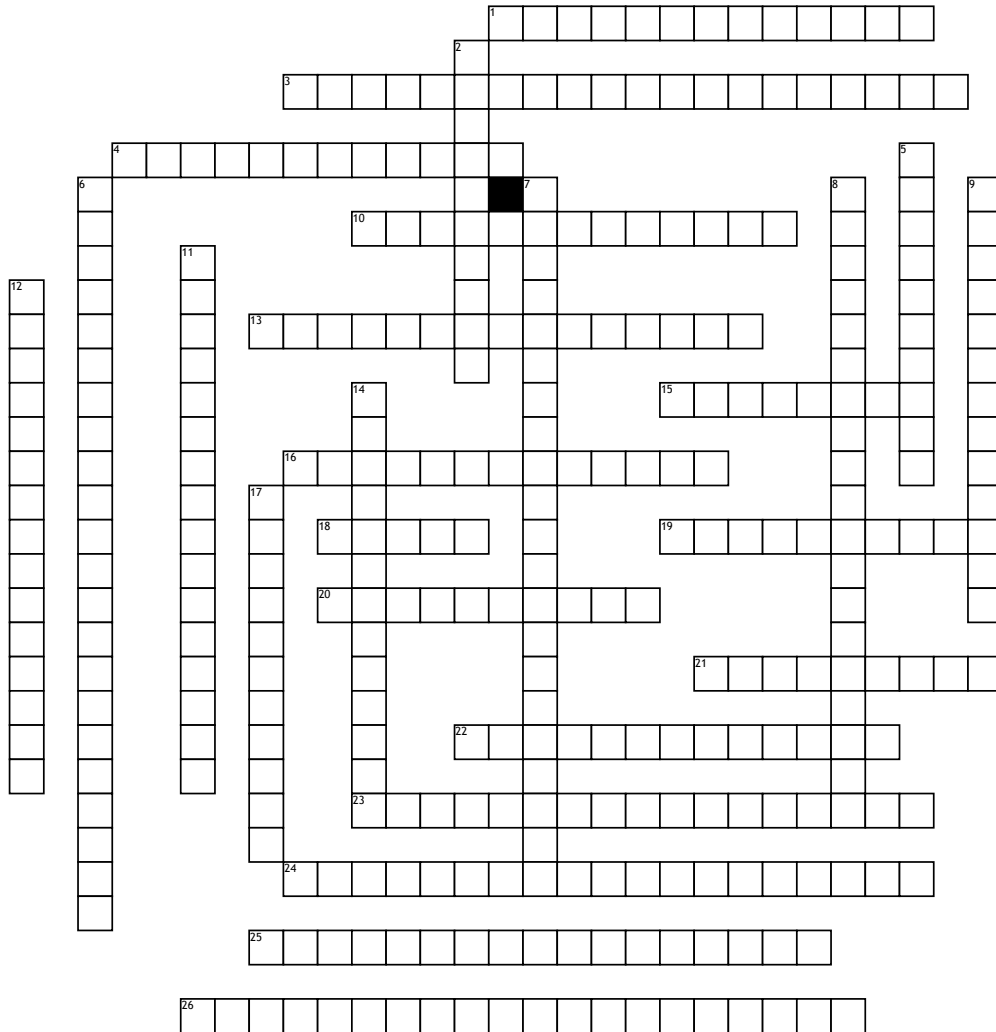


Progressivism Crossword Puzzle

- 1. Allows the Congress to levy an income tax without apportioning it among the states or basing it on the United States Census.
- 3. The central banking system of the United States of America; after a series of financial panics led to the desire for central control of the monetary system in order to alleviate financial crises.
- 4. Christian faith practice as a call not just to personal conversation but to social reform.
- 10. An American statesman and academic who served as the 28th President of the United States from 1913 to 1921.
- 13. An institution in an inner-city area providing, recreational, & other social services.
- 15. Political franchise, or simply franchise is the right to vote in public, political elections.
- 16. Prohibits the states and the federal government from denying the right to vote to citizens of the United States on the basis of sex.
- 18. An organization formed on February 18, 1890 to advocate in favor of women's suffrage in the United States.
- 19. Moderation or voluntary self-restraint.

- 20. Direct vote in which an entire electorate is invited to vote on a particular proposal. This may result in the adoption of a new law.

 - 23. An American statesman and writer who served as the 26th President of the United States from 1901 to 1909.
 - 24. A period of wide spread social activism & political reform across the U.S.
 - 25. Was the 27th President of the United States and the tenth Chief Justice of the United States, the only person to have held both offices.
 - 26. A theory of management that analyzes and synthesizes workflows. Its main objective is improving economic efficiency, especially labour productivity.

- 2. Known as the "Mother" of social activists and was a pioneer American settlement activist/reformer, social worker.

- 6. A federal agency, established in 1914 that administers antitrust and consumer protection legislation of free and fair competition in the marketplace.
- 7. A political convention held every four years in the United States by most of the political parties who will be fielding nominees in the upcoming U.S. presidential election.
- 8. An agency of the U.S. federal government that manages all national parks; historical properties w/ various title designations.
- 9. Established the popular election of United States Senators by the people of the states. The amendment supersedes Article I, §3, Clauses 1 and 2 of the Constitution, under which senators were elected by state legislatures.
- 11. Known as "Fighting Bob" American politician & reformer.
- 12. The process by which voters, either the general public or members of a political party, can indicate their preference for a candidate in an upcoming general election or by-election, thus narrowing the field of candidates.
- 14. Prohibiting the manufacture and transports of alcohol in the U.S.
- 17. The prevention by law of the manufacture & sale of alcohol in the U.S.
