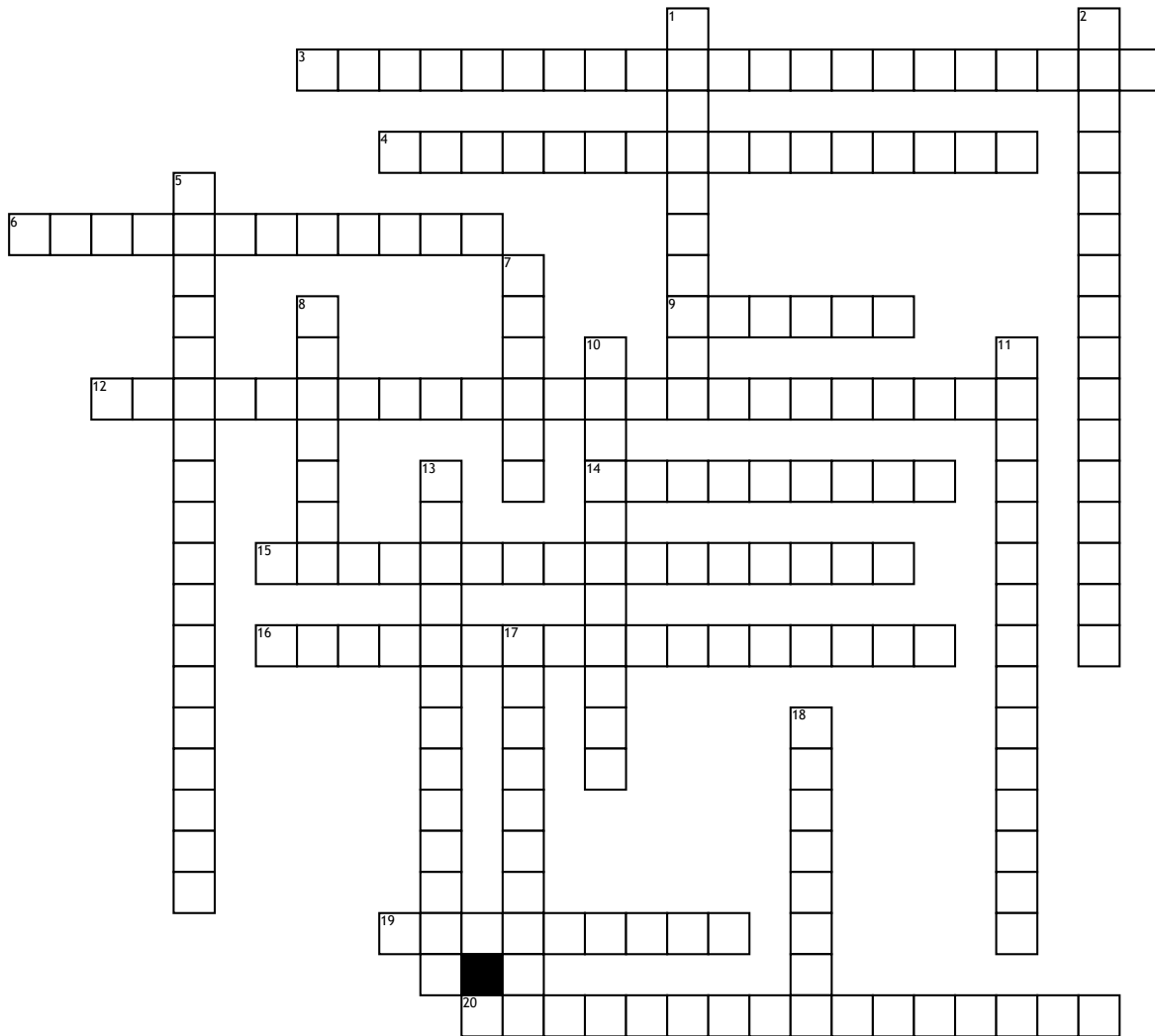

4. the total group to be studied or described and from whom samples may be drawn

6. a survey population, selected by chance, which fairly represents the general population

9. a research technique for acquiring data about the attitudes or behaviors of a group of people, usually by asking questions of a representative

12. study of behavior in naturally occurring situations without manipulation or control on the part of the observer

14. to repeat a research study, usually with different participants and in different situations, to confirm the results of the original study

15. denoting a test or trial, especially of a drug, in which any information that may influence the behavior of the tester or the subject is withheld until after the test

16. a variable whose value depends on that of another

19. a process or record of research in which detailed consideration is given to the development of a particular person, group, or situation over a period of time

20. a sample drawn in such a way that known subgroups within a population are represented in proportion to their numbers in the general population
