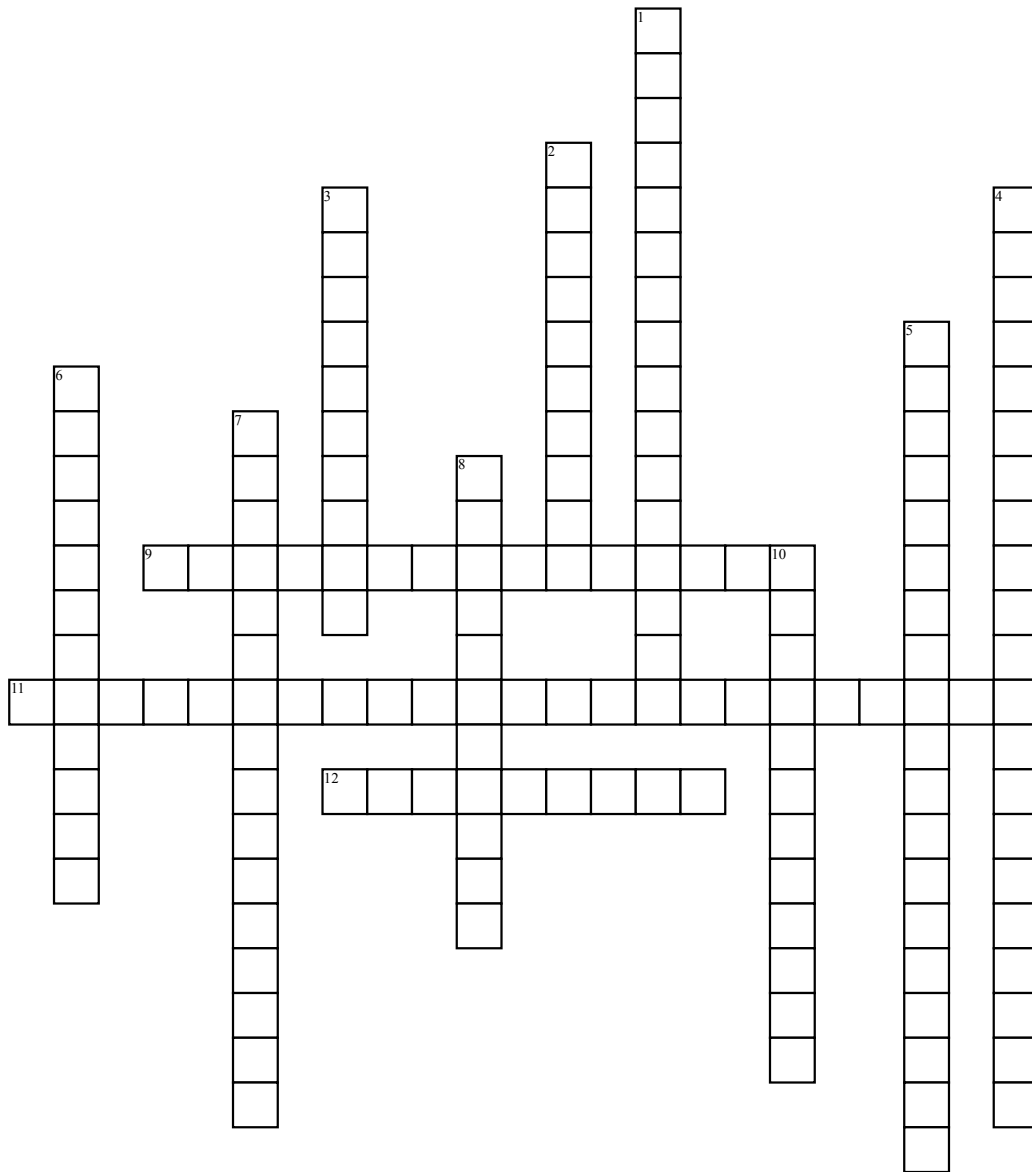

- 9. A tendency for research participants to behave in a certain way because they know they are being observed or they believe they know what the researcher wants.
- 11. Observing and recording behavior in naturally occurring situations without trying to manipulate and control the situation.
- 12. A research technique in which one person is studied in depth in the hope of revealing universal principles.

- 1. The tendency to focus on information that supports preconceptions.
