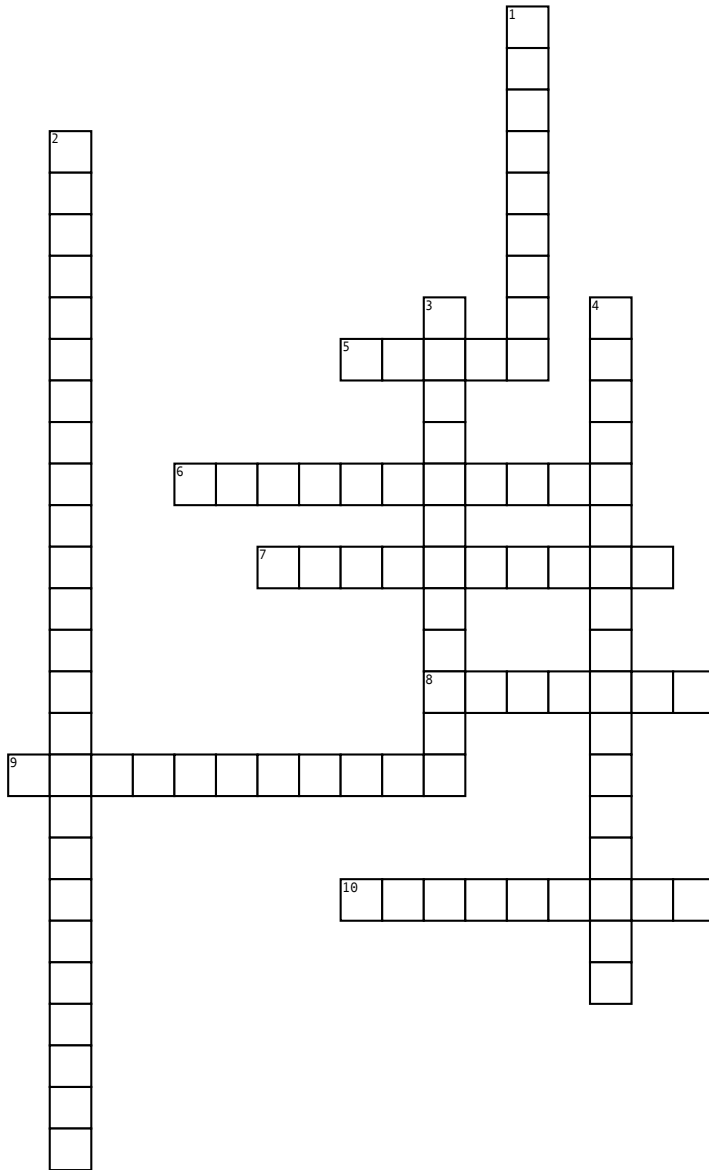

7. Those who are physically, mentally, and emotionally healthy and have no illnesses, injuries, or conditions that make it difficult to participate in tasks that others do.

8. Refers to a system of discrimination and exclusion that oppresses those who have mental, emotional, and physical disabilities.

9. A concept that stands for the assertion of judgments that act as societal guidelines of what is acceptable and not acceptable.

10. Refers to a system that results in disadvantages for those of the transgender and nonbinary community.

1. Those who identify with the gender they were assigned at birth.

2. Refers to the notion that heterosexuality is socioculturally enforced, particularly upon women.

3. The categorization of people into two distinct groups of gender based on the sex they were assigned at birth (cisgender).

4. A concept that explains how the differing systems of power (including gender, race, and class) intersect to create degrees of oppressive and discriminatory acts within societal structures.
